A Painful 'Tail-Bone'

Many a nervous woman wants to know if she should let her doctor cut out her sore and painful tailbone, or coccyx. I am surprised that her physician can be such an optimist as to hope that he can succeed with an operation, which every surgeon I have ever met says never did any good. I have seen scores of women with a painful coccyx, and they were all highly nervous. Most of them had some insane relative. One can x-ray a sore coccyx, one can examine it with a finger through the rectum, and one can move it back and forth on its joint, but practically never can one find anything wrong with it. After 50 years of studying these women, I feel strongly that their pain is much like a headache, and, like a headache, it is due to some nervous tension.

Operation on the Brain For Insanity

Many worried relatives of an insane person write asking about the operation of prefrontal lobotomy, and whether they should consent to having it done on their loved one. Naturally, I cannot tell them what to do because I do not know what the exact situation is in regard to their relative. All I know is that a few years ago, in mental hospitals, many of the persons who seemed to have reached a hopeless stage, and perhaps were at times violent and hard to take care of, were operated on. In a moment the surgeon made a cut which separated much of front of the brain from the back part. With this, the patient was likely to be much quieter and less aggressive. He might become somewhat of an automaton, so much so perhaps that he could be cared for again at home.

Partly because in some cases there are unpleasant results from the operation, few psychiatrists like it very much; and I understand that in recent years in most mental hospitals it is being used as seldom as possible.

Man's Relatives Know Best

Now Sane He Is

At times, when in a court room I have seen psychiatrists differing decidedly as to the sanity of a man, I have thought to myself, if I were the judge, I would dismiss all the experts and would send for the man's relatives and old friends. I would much prefer to hear what they thought of his sanity. They would know what is often most important of all, and this is, that of late he had changed markedly in his ways of thinking and behaving.

Often when a business man is able to keep passing as sane among the people to whom he sells in his store, his wife and children will know that something serious has happened to him mentally. Perhaps he, who was always kindly and soft-spoken, is now cursing his daughters obscenely, or he who was always a good churchman, is now cursing religion, or he who was always frugal, is now throwing his money about.

I remember well an associate of mine who had always been odd and eccentric and inclined to go into tantrums in which for a few minutes he would squeal with rage. For years I had forgiven him for these exhibitions because, after each one of them, he would grin at me in a sheepish way, and perhaps do some kind act to show that he was sorry. But when he started to go insane, he no longer was ashamed or sorry; he was mean. Hence I could no longer stand the nervous strain of working alongside of him, and I had to leave.

Year later, when he began to write letters to the President of the United States and to tell people about his 10 gorgeous wives, his friends realized that he "had become too eccentric even for him" and had him committed.

Called Neighbors

I got to thinking of this other day as I was reading in a magazine Jerry Giesler's story of his defense of a man whose wife had had him committed, and later in court had brought in "a horde of psychiatric experts," all of whom testified that the man was incompetent and suffering from a form of mental degeneration that "would surely kill him within a year."

I think Giesler was very wise in not hiring another group of psychiatrists to testify that the man was sane. Giesler just called in the fellow's neighbors—the people who knew him best—and they

testified that he was sane; they said his trouble was that he was at his wit's end because of annoyance from his wife. The jury agreed with the neighbors, and the man was free. Some 5 or 10 years later, Giesler met him and he still was sane!

To show to what extent some courts will now go in demanding only "experts" as witnesses, recently when I was testifying in a case, it was necessary to put into the record the fact that the patient, for years before his death, had been so blind that he had had to be led around. The defense attorney took exception, saying that the man's cronies could not testify to this fact—only an ophthalmologist could—and the objection was sustained! To me, this seemed silly.

Cancer Insurance Policy Response Said 'Amazing'

Los Angeles—UPI—Response to a new cancer insurance program that promises half the premium profit for cancer research has been unbelievable, according to the insurance company.

Alfred L. Golden, vice president of the Beneficial Standard Life Insurance Co. of Los Angeles, said first reaction to the policy announced Jan. 25 was from insurance brokers and agents.

Golden said one half of the premium profits would go to cancer research. He said, however, there haven't been enough policies sold yet to accrue money to start the charity program.

Society Not Contacted

The American Cancer Society said it had heard of the policy and expected the donations would be made on a national level. It said the company had not yet contacted them.

"This is the only time an outfit has gone into business to put itself out of business," Golden said.

"This plan—we hope the big boys join us—could mean millions of dollars for research. We hope for something equivalent to a crash program. We've got to find a cure for cancer and it's just around the corner, we believe."

Cost of the policy, for medical expenses because of cancer, would be about \$15 yearly for a person under 39, Golden said.

He said even though no promotional material had been circulated, the policy had been sold to more than 100 persons.

"It's been amazing," Golden said, "people call in wanting to know more about it. We just weren't ready for this response."

Autos Collide In Jacksonville

A two-car traffic accident in Jacksonville Saturday night sent Shirley Molander, 32, Jacksonville to the Rogue Valley hospital with undetermined injuries.

Jacksonville Chief of Police Frank Carter said the accident occurred about 7:50 p.m. when a car operated by Maurice Wayne McCraw, 20, of 794 Lozier lane, came around a slight curve and struck the Molander auto which was pulling away from the curb in front of 912 North Fifth st.

McCraw was cited for violation of the basic rule. Carter said both cars were badly damaged and were towed away from the scene.

LaVale hawthorn, Crataegus laval, this tree grows to a height of 21 feet and is rather spreading. Its stout spines are two inches long; the twigs are hairy. The white or red flowers are disk like and hairy. The leaves are oval oblong obovate, or wedge-shaped, two to four inches long and have a pointed tip. They are unevenly toothed below the middle; they are lustrous; in autumn turn red or orange, remaining on the tree very late.

This is the tree for Jackson (except from Genesee to the Railroad tracks) 40 to 50 feet apart, and on Mae st., 50 to 60 feet apart.
