Operation, Maintenance of School Plant Big Budget Item

(Editor's note: This is another in a series of articles reviewing the proposed \$3,914,846.99 general fund budget for School District 549C. An election on the budget will be held May 2 at seven polling places in the district. Today's article concerns the budget for operating and maintaining district facilities.)

Providing facilities in which an educational program may be housed is an important aspect of any school district budget.

Educational leaders today are generally agreed that comfort plays an important role in how the pupil's studies progress, and the student's incentive to participate in classwork.

The Medford school district budget committee has estimated it will take \$822,230.99 of its proposed \$3,914,846.99 1960-61 budget to operate and maintain its plant facilities.

Utilities, other than heating fuel, which includes water, lights and telephone, are estimated to cost \$68,385 with the largest outlay for lights (estimated at \$49,475).

Other expenses for operation are expected to total \$3,112,500 for car allowances, garbage service and a prorated share of one superintendent's car allowance.

The \$293,661.50 estimated to operate the plant next year compares with about \$275,918 listed for operation of plant during the present school year.

A total of \$291,287.08 has been allocated for maintenance of plant, compared to an estimated \$220,049.18 this school year. \$152,380 is earmarked for salaries for plumbers, electricians, carpenters, painters, truck drivers, roofers and a prorated share of a superintendent's pay.

Additional Personnel—Included in the salaries for maintenance is an additional \$15,600 for next year to pay a painter, plumber, a general maintenance man and a boiler cleaner. The addition of maintenance personnel will help relieve the work load now carried, and relieve overtime work now necessary.

Materials and supplies are estimated to cost \$110,850. This includes lumber, paint, small tools, electrical wiring, plumbing fixtures and pipe, roofing supplies and general warehouse stock.

A total of \$26,629.58 has been budgeted for replacement of equipment, including tool replacement, a half-ton pickup truck, maintenance and custodial equipment, and new desks. Some \$1,015 has been allocated for contracted service and another \$412.50 for the supervisor's car expense and a prorated share of the superintendent's car expense.

Correct Defects—Provision has been made in maintenance of plant to correct defects in the heating plants at Medford High school and Jefferson school, and to replace light fixtures at Howard school.

Hydrofoil Cargo Vessel Proposed

Washington—(UPI)—Sen. Warren G. Magnuson (D-Wash.) has urged federal construction of a large, ocean-going hydrofoil cargo vessel that could ride the waves at speeds of more than 100 miles an hour.

Magnuson, chairman of the Senate Commerce committee which handles maritime matters, said Monday it was time to apply jet age speed and technology to America's water commerce.

He introduced a bill authorizing the project. It was similar to legislation introduced in the House earlier this year by Rep. Thomas M. Pelly (R-Wash.). No estimate was given.
