**1/2 teaspoon dry mustard**  
**1 tablespoon finely chopped green pepper**  
**2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice**  
**1/3 cup catsup**  
**1 well-beaten egg**

**Biscuit mix**

This dish, as we said, is prepared upside down so it is turned over when taken from the oven. Slice one unpeeled lemon into five or six slices according to number of servings planned. Place lemon slices in bottom of a greased eight-inch baking dish. Combine tuna, onion, bread crumbs, seasonings and well-beaten egg, blending lightly but well.

Press tuna mixture over lemon slices; then cover with a layer of sliced Cheddar cheese. Make a dough of one cup of biscuit mix or use your favorite biscuit recipe with one cup of flour. Spread over cheese layer and bake in hot oven, 400 degrees, for about 15 minutes or until light brown.

Turn upside-down and cut into pie-shaped pieces. Serve while hot, plain or with a cream sauce. For a fancy cream sauce, add some chopped-up pimientos. **Orange-Mini Cream**

For a superlative dessert, combine two cups bite-size orange chunks, one-half cup peppermint stick candy, crushed, and one-half cup chopped pecans. Whip one cup whipping cream; add orange-candy-pecan mixture. Serve in tall sherbet glasses. Six servings. You might like to add a few miniature marshmallows to this.

**Sauce Pork Roast With Pineapple**  
The pork shoulder butt, an excellent piece meat for roasting, is very reasonable in cost; reacts especially well to a fruity coating during cooking period.

**4 to 5 pounds pork shoulder butt**  
**3 tablespoons brown sugar**  
**1/2 teaspoon salt**  
**1/4 cup vinegar**  
**1/4 cup water**  
**1/2 cup catsup**  
**1 can (8 1/2 ounces) crushed pineapple**  
**1 tablespoon soy sauce**

Place roast, fat side up, on a rack in a shallow roasting pan. Roast, uncovered, in a 325 degree oven, 45 to 50 minutes per pound. Meanwhile, combine sugar and salt and stir in vinegar, water, catsup, pineapple and soy sauce. Cook five minutes, stirring constantly.

About an hour before end of roasting time, pour the sauce over the meat and baste every 20 minutes by spooning the sauce from bottom of the pan. Skim fat from the sauce remaining in pan and serve sauce with cooked meat. Hope for some left over for tomorrow.

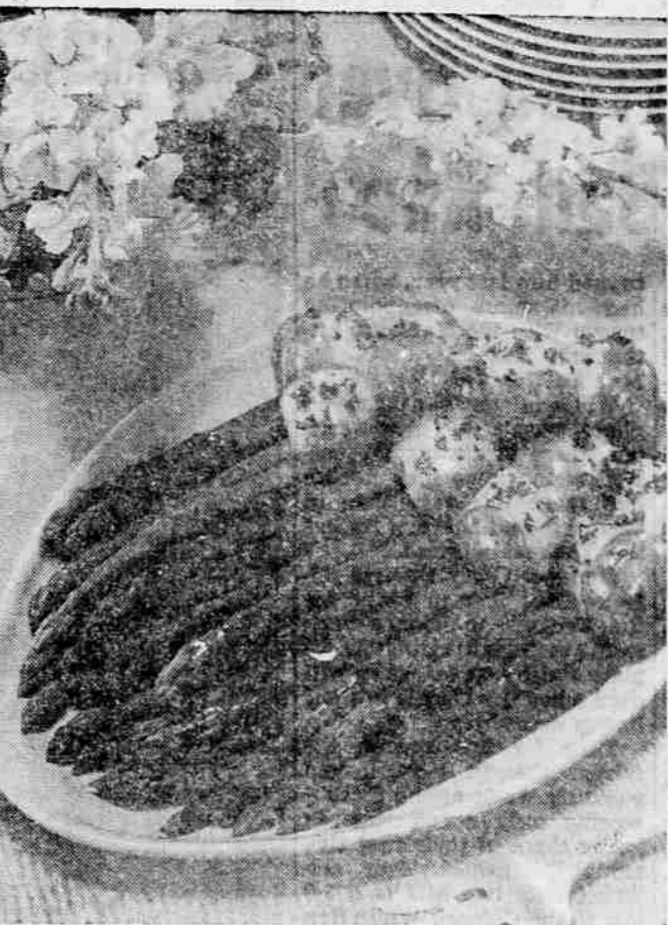

Halibut is the most highly prized of all white fleshed fish, is a boon to the budget, a helping hand to health, is mighty tasty eating, fresh or frozen, in many ways.

Fillet of sole, plentiful in fresh and frozen form enjoys great popularity when broiled, baked, boiled, steamed, used for chowder, pan fried or deep fat fried.

Scallops are in the Lenten season spotlight; are highly prized for superb flavor, interesting texture. Available fresh and frozen, packed with good nutrition, reasonable in cost, they're often breaded and fried, offered in combination with potato chips. They're good pan fried, deep fat fried, in cocktails, appetizers, soups, salads and other specialties.

Shrimp, the most popular of all shellfish are plentiful; available fresh or frozen, raw, cooked and breaded. Satisfying fried, in cocktails, salads and infinite variety of casserole dishes.

**Other Potentials**  
Eggs are again headline news. Attractive buys in pork continue. High quality of beef coming to market deserves special attention. Lamb, big west coast favorite, is often speccialied; has many economy cuts. Broiler-fryers are bargain-priced.

Fruit displays offer avocados, apples, bananas, oranges, grapefruit, lemons. Vegetable bins are piled high with cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, dry onions, potatoes, lettuce, bunched vegetables; feature new
