Cameras and microphones will be placed in Westminster Abbey May 6 to broadcast and televise Margaret's wedding to former photographer Antony Armstrong-Jones as it happens.

Queen Elizabeth's wedding in 1947 was broadcast by the British Broadcasting corporation, but not televised.

BBC radio will broadcast a running account of the May 6 ceremony to the world.
