Attorneys Defend Portland Papers

Portland—UPP—Attorneys for the Oregon Journal and the Oregonian Thursday defended in Circuit court the right of the two newspapers to publish stories about confessions to Jan. 31 newspaper truck dynamitings.

Attorneys appeared in resistance to a move by counsel for Levi S. McDonald to have the newspapers declared in contempt of court for publication of confessions before indictments were returned.

McDonald and four others have been indicted in connection with the dynamitings.

The newspaper attorneys said the publication of news stories relating to confessions by Charles, Edward and William Snyder and Gerald Allen Couzens was entitled to full protection under constitutional guarantees.

As soon as the clarion call has gone out, he begins strutting his stuff, inspecting personally every food-find, and making decisions for the good of the flock. Of course he is full of pep, as fresh as a daisy. Why shouldn't he be—he "went to bed last night with the chickens."
