Squaw Valley, Calif. - (UPI) - The University of Nevada won the jumping event Sunday to climax its victory in the Far West Invitational Intercollegiate ski meet—regarded as the 1960 Pacific Coast championships. Worse Than Score
In whipping the favored California team Saturday night the sophomores showed no lack of experience. The final score was 75-55 - but really it was worse than that.

The Buckeyes poured 16 out of their first 17 field goal attempts from the floor through the hoop, took a 37-19 lead at the half time - and that was it.

It was a staggering defeat for the defending champions, who Friday night defeated Cincinnati and Oscar Robertson, 77-69, in what was considered the "dream game" be-

tween the top two teams in the country.

California held Robertson to just 18 points - but he bounced back with 32 Saturday night as he led the Bearcats to a 95-71 victory over New York University in a battle for third place.

Lucas Outstanding
The 56 sports writers who covered the tournament were so impressed that they: (1) named Jerry Lucas, the giant sophomore, as the outstanding player of the tournament, he got 49 of the 56 votes; and (2) named all five starters from the Ohio State team on the first or second squads.

Named with Lucas on the first team were Oscar Robertson, Cincinnati; Darrall Imhoff, California; Tom Sanders, New York University; and Joe Nowell, Ohio State. On the second team were Bill McClintock and Tandy Gillis, California; Paul Hogue, Cincinnati; and John Havlicek, Joe Roberts and Larry Siegfried, Ohio State.

Duck Runners Capture Honors

Hollywood, Fla. - (UPI) - Three Oregon distance runners made a sweep of their respective events here Saturday in the Hollywood relays.

Dyrol Burleson, sophomore Oregon miler, switched to the 880 in this meet and won it in the time of 1:50.0 but missed by two-tenths of a second to qualify for the Olympic trials this summer. A 1:48.0 was needed in this, the first of 17 outdoor meets marked as official qualifying events.

Bill Dellinger, ex-Oregon distance star, won the three-mile in 14:00.7 but was more than 15 seconds off the needed time to qualify.

The other Oregon entry, Jim Grelle, captured the mile in 4:08.9.

The three distance runners will get their next chance at qualifying in the Willamette relays in two weeks at Salem.

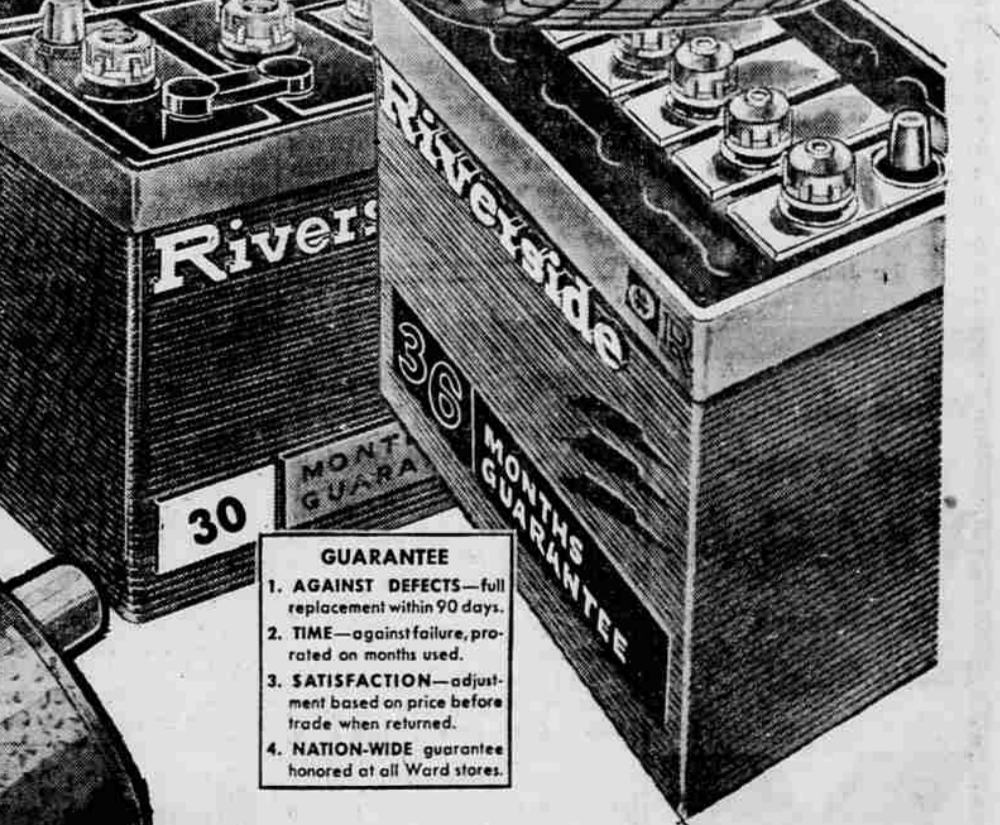
