

# NIBL Dominates AAU Hoop Tussle

Denver—UPI—The National Industrial Basketball league turned the National AAU tourney into a league affair in the quarter-final round today.

Eight of the NIBL's nine teams qualified Wednesday for the third round. Only the Denver-Chicago Truckers missed out in the quarter-finals.

The New York Tuck Tapers beat out the Truckers, 79-75, in a thriller Wednesday night.

Tonight's feature games pit the Phillips Oilers, tourney favorite and NIBL champion, against the San Francisco Investors, and defending AAU champion Wichita Vickers against the Seattle Buchanan Bakers.

Akron's 119-107 defeat of the Marion-Kay team from Brownstown, Ind., set a new AAU mark of 226 points—20 above the old record.

Seattle beat the San Francisco Olympic Club, 94-77; Peoria defeated the JAMACO Saints of Chicago, 98-73. Cleveland whipped the U.S. Army All-Stars, 90-79, and the Investors defeated Kirby Shoes of Los Angeles, 88-70, in Wednesday's second round.
