6,870 Groups Express Opinions in Decisions Program in Country

A record number of "Great Decisions" participants have volunteered their opinions on the topic: "What Chances for India's Middle Way?" in the latest national survey of the world affairs study program, compiled by the Foreign Policy Association, Inc., New York.

Only 11 per cent of those included in the survey were in favor of putting pressure on India to abandon its non-alignment policy, and to join the anticommunist coalition. Sixty-eight per cent favored greater Indian participation in international conferences such as summit meetings, and 56 per cent gave support to a permanent UN Security Council seat for India.

Prior to volunteering their opinions, "Great Decisions" group members had spent a week of study and discussion on the problems of India, the world's largest democracy. Greatest agreement came
