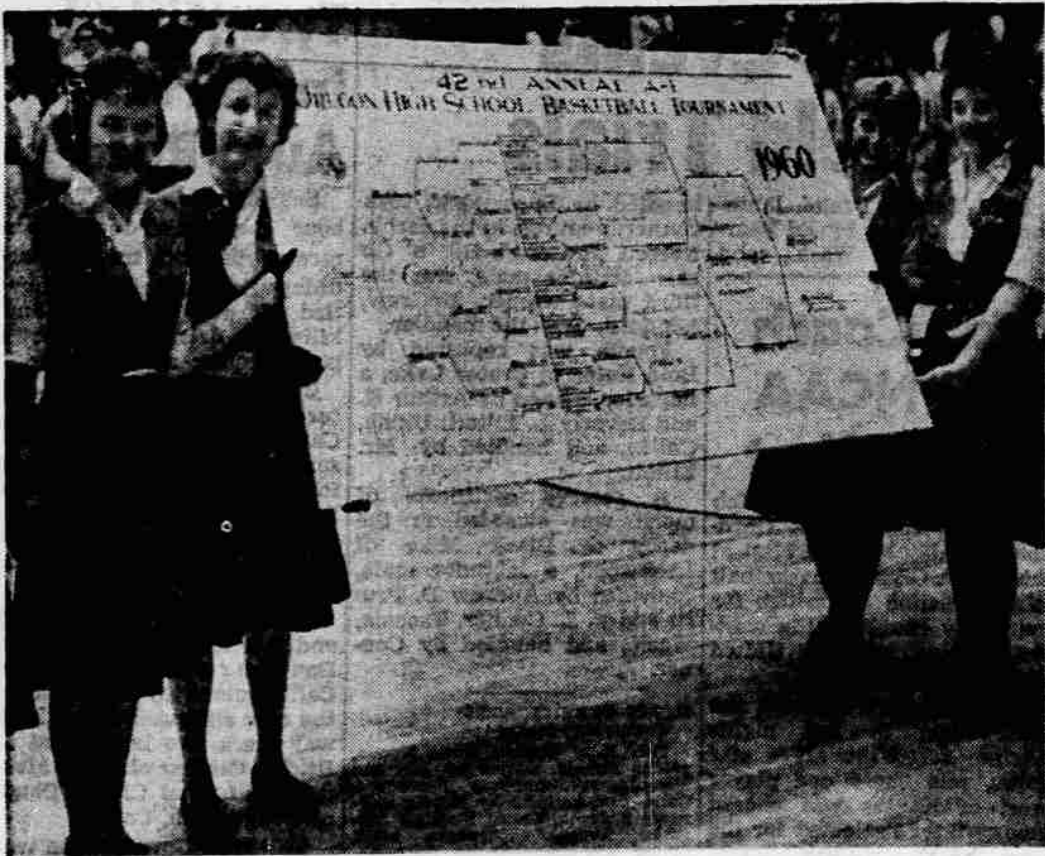

The golf spotlight focuses on Rogue Valley Country club on Monday and Tuesday. Medford's links will be scene of the last two days of a southern Oregon three-day pro - amateur tournament. Opening play was slated to day at Roseburg.

Some 20 or more professionals of Oregon and south-west Washington are contending with four amateur partners each and play here will be in fivesomes. There are both daily and overall tournament prizes.

Heading the list of pros are such players as Bob Duden, Boots Porterfield, Eddie Hogan, Eddie Oldfield, Bill Eggers, Harold West and Bunny Mason.

Second in Centennial

Duden, Portland, has been playing on the pro circuit. He was second in the Centennial Open last year at Portland and on the following week ended tied with Jack Fleck for runner-up in the Hesperia Open. The tourneys were won by Billy Casper and Eric Monti, respectively.

Porterfield won the Oregon title of the Professional Golfers association in both 1958 and 1959. He is pro for both Grants Pass and Ashland links.

Hogan, Riverside, Portland, who won the pro-am which ended here last spring, has been a top linksman in the northwest for many years. Some 25 years ago he became the youngest golfer ever to win the Northwest Open. He took the honors at the age of 19.

Oldfield, now at Astoria, is an ex-Medford high player who won state prep medalist laurels. He has been one of the top northwest pro tourney players in recent years. West, Longview, Wash., has won a number of Oregon and northwest titles. Eggers, Portland, was second in the Alemeniden tourney in California last year in contention with some of the big time pros. Mason, Salem, is a former Oregon Open winner.

Chicago (UPI) - A new professional basketball league appeared to be in the making.

Representatives from nine U. S. cities, including Honolulu, Hawaii, expressed desire for franchises in the proposed loop after Thursday's meetings presided over by Abe Saperstein, owner of the Harlem Globetrotters.

Saperstein said no hard decisions were made at the meeting. The representatives will report to their home cities and return for more "definite" sessions in Chicago April 21, he said.

"No commitments were made. It is all exploratory work toward formation of a new pro league," Saperstein said.

Among those at the meeting were Harry Glickman, of Multnomah Stadium, Portland, Ore., and Arthur Kim, representing Honolulu businessmen.

Medford Edges Roseburg Twice In Season Openers

First baseman Lowell Dean bombed over four runs on three hits and a sacrifice fly yesterday afternoon when Medford high's baseball season got off to a bright beginning.

Medford bounced Roseburg 5 to 0 and 3 to 2 in a double-header here. The encounters were non-league affairs. The Tornadoes next go into action Wednesday afternoon when they entertain Ashland in another non-counting fray.

Dean and Mike Parsons took the slugging honors and pitchers Herb Wheeler and Bob Quinney combined to hold the Indians to three hits in the seven inning opening mix.

Four of the first game runs crossed home in the sixth inning when Ken Jensen and Calvin Dean walked, Lowell Dean socked a sharp-powered single and Parsons dumped the ball along the right field line for a three-base hit. In the fourth frame Jensen walked, went to second base on a passed ball and reached third after the catch on Cal Dean's flyout. Lowell Dean lined safely to right to bring Jensen home.

Parsons put a fly ball in along the right field line in the second inning for a double and went to third on a wild pitch. He was out at home on a double steal effort. He and Lowell Dean each had two runs batted in during the game.

Medford tallied twice in the first inning of the second game when Dick Ragsdale singled, and Jim Barry and Cal Dean walked. Ragsdale scored after Lowell Dean's flyout to left field and Barry romped in on a safe rap by Quinney with the ball bouncing off Roseburg pitcher Ron Lake. Barry got on base on an error and Lowell Dean doubled in the third inning for the other Medford counter. The ball dropped into deep left field and bounced against the tennis court fence.

Roseburg put over a single run in the fourth inning when Marlin Burgess was hit by a pitch, Howard Gausnell walked

WINTER ANGLING ENDS

Portland-Anglers are advised by the Oregon game commission that with the exception of the Wilson river, Thursday, March 31, is the last day for winter angling in the streams and lakes of zone 1. The Wilson river will remain open to angling below Kansas creek bridge for salmon, jack salmon and steelhead 12 inches or more in length. Coos bay and Tillamook bay will remain open to salmon angling. Winter angling regulations will apply on most inland waters through April 22 at which time summer bag limits will prevail. The Columbia and Snake rivers are open to salmon and steelhead angling the entire year except in the month of November.

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
