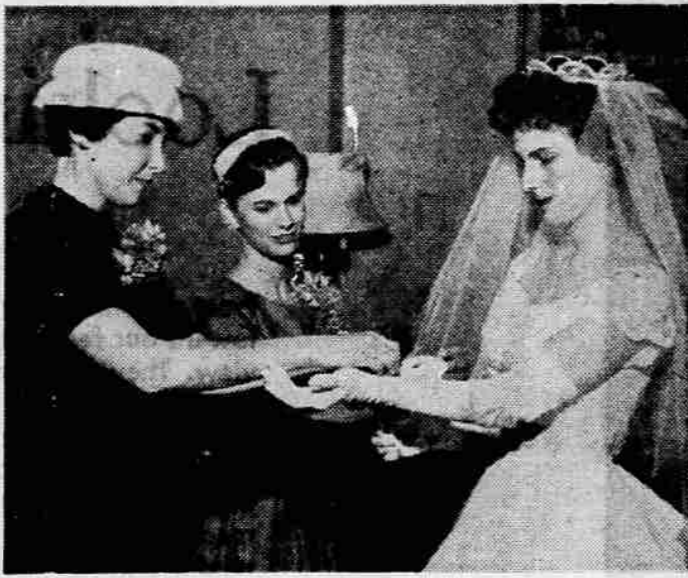
## Grandparents Attend Wedding
