

Bomarc Missile Cutback Planned

Washington (UPI)—The Air Force has decided on a \$370 million cutback in the production of the Bomarc anti-aircraft missile, congressional sources said Friday.

The Air Force had originally proposed in President Eisenhower's budget for fiscal year 1961 to spend \$420 million on the controversial weapon. Under the new recommendation the program would be cut to \$50 million for the fiscal year beginning next July 1.

The decision to make the major slash in procurement of the Bomarc was based on the ground that the weapon is becoming obsolete against the sharply increasing threat of the intercontinental ballistic missile.

Why 'Sugar Diabetes'?
 People write to know why their disease is called "sugar diabetes." Actually, this is a layman's term never used by a doctor. He calls it diabetes mellitus, because the urine contains sugar. The term mellitus comes from an old word for honey. The reason for adding this second term is that there is another disease—a very different and rare one—called diabetes insipidus, in which the urine is not sweet. It is just watery. In this disease the person passes from 15 to 30 quarts of urine a day; and, of course, he must drink an equal amount of water. He usually has something wrong with his pituitary gland (at the base of his brain), or with some of the tissues around it. The patients can be greatly helped by using a pituitary snuff, or injections of a special preparation of pitressin tannate. Diabetes is due to a destruction of certain cells in what are called the "islets of Langerhans" in the pancreas, which is the big digestive gland which lies back of the stomach. Diabetes mellitus can be helped by diet, by insulin, and now by some newly-found chemicals that can be taken by mouth.

Pre-School Clinic Slated for Jewett
 Central Point—Bill Brewster, Jewett school principal, has announced scheduling of a pre-school clinic April 21 and April 28. The clinic will be held between 9 a. m. and 3 p. m. at the Jewett school.

Each year this service is provided for pre-school children who will be entering the first grade in the fall. As part of the child's preparation for entering school, the state department of education requires that each youngster have a physical examination. To aid the parents in obtaining the examination, the Jackson County health department conducts pre-school clinics in the county during the spring preceding fall enrollment. Youngsters are examined without charge by Dr. C. I. Drummond, medical director of the Jackson County Health department. Parents who wish to have their child examined are asked to call the Jewett school at NO 4-1114, for an appointment.

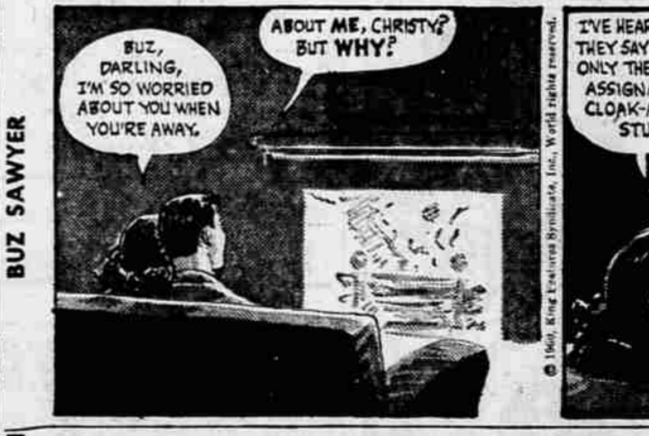
