From Washington:  
The Army has mapped a year study of the frightening possibility that the myriad of electronic devices employed by a modern fighting force MIGHT JAM EACH OTHER IN COMBAT!

Maj. Gen. Robert J. Wood of the Army's research and development office told about the problem in closed-door testimony to the House Defense Appropriations subcommittee on Feb. 23. His testimony has been made public. He said that with rapid strides in electronics the modern battlefield is becoming overrun with gadgets that use electromagnetic waves. These range from a walkie-talkie radio to the complex centers used to guide missiles.

"If the Army went to war today, it would have at least 30 THOUSAND electronic emitter devices in a square 60 miles on each of its four sides."

That doesn't count Navy and Air Force gadgets—or what the enemy forces might have."

Is all these wave-emitting radio, with which modern war is waged went into action all at once, in one battle, they might STYMIE EACH OTHER SO COMPLETELY that the battle would come to a stop and thousands of people who might otherwise have died would remain alive.

**SPEED the day!**  
In that event, we might have the common horse sense to CALL OFF WAR.

**FROM SALEM:**  
At a press conference Gov. Mark Hatfield said his Eastern trip last week resulted in 14 "very warm industrial possibilities that might result in new payrolls for Oregon."

Oregon's governor and 19 Oregon businessmen made the trip to New York, Washington and Chicago. They met with 40 representatives of industry, finance and government in an effort to get them to establish plants in Oregon. At his conference in Salem, Gov. Hatfield added:

"Our main pitch was not that we wanted to take industry away from the East. What we were there for, we told them, was to PERSUADE INDUSTRY TO EXPAND TO SERVE THE EXPANDING MARKETS IN THE WEST."

**THE WEST is changing.**

There was a time when there weren't enough people east of the Rockies to support over ONE big industry—let alone hundreds of them. In those days, the West got its manufactured goods from the East—with the freight added.

In those days, nearly all national advertisements for consumer goods carried this note: "Prices HIGHER in the West." Not any more. We now have OUR OWN MARKET. It's a GROWING market. The eleven Western states are increasing in population twice as fast percentage-wise as the rest of the country.

Industry is moving westward to take advantage of this growing market.

IN THOSE earlier days, we yelled bloody murder for lower transcontinental freight rates so that we could get our raw materials back East to the factories where they were fabricated and could then get the finished products back to us as cheaply as possible.

NOW abnormally low transcontinental freight rates tend to be a handicap rather than an asset because they make it easier for Eastern manufacturers to get their products into our growing Western market in competition with our growing Western industries.

We now say to the Easterners: "If you want your share of our burgeoning Western market MOVE YOUR FACTORIES OUT HERE TO THE WEST AND CREATE PAYROLLS HERE."

**Sentence Imposition Suspended in Court**
