**The Significance of High Blood Pressure**

Back around 1919, when I was making a statistical study of blood pressures in some 15,000 university freshmen, I came to a conclusion which at that time a few physicians could accept, and that was that in persons under 40 a blood pressure of 140 systolic and 80 diastolic meant that, later in life, the person would have hypertension. Recently, a report was made to the American Public Health Association by Edward A. Lew, a statistician of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Co. He has carried out an extensive study of what happened to slightly hypertensive persons over a 20-year period. His conclusion is that a pressure of even 140/80 in a seemingly healthy person under the age of 40 indicates a 30 per cent higher-than-normal mortality risk.

The study showed, also, what I learned long ago from abundant experience, and this is that women stand high blood pressure much better than men do. In many women past 50 it does not behave like a disease, and the woman is little likely to come to grief because of it. Factors that make the outlook worse for a person are over-weight, a family history of early death due to trouble with the arteries in the brain or the heart or the kidneys, and the constant presence of albumin in the urine. Today, people who are definitely under-weight represent the best mortality risks. Everyone should know that there are four grades of hypertension—Grades 1 and 2 are not very bad; Grade 3 is bad, and usually soon incapacitates a man. Grade 4 is what is called malignant hypertension. One type is rapidly fatal, while another type is sometimes compatible with a high degree of recovery.
