**Touhy Accomplice Denied Clemency**

Springfield, Ill. —(AP) — Gov. William Stratton Thursday denied executive clemency to Basil (The Owl) Banghart, notorious prohibition era gangster and convicted accomplice of the late Roger Touhy.

Banghart and Touhy were imprisoned for the 1933 kidnaping of John (Jake the Barber) Factor. Both escaped from Stateville Penitentiary in 1942 but were recaptured a month later.

Touhy was shot down in gangland style last December less than three weeks after winning parole. Banghart is still serving a 99-year sentence.

**Step-Up Urged in Program To Preserve Food With Radiation**

Washington (AP)—Two Democratic members of the congressional atomic energy committee have prodded the Eisenhower administration to step up an experimental program for preserving food through nuclear radiation.

Under the program, radiation is used to kill bacteria which causes food decay. Chairman Clinton P. Anderson (D-N.M.) of the senate-house committee and Chairman Melvin Price (D-Ill.) of its research subcommittee issued a joint statement announcing that hearings on the program will be resumed Thursday. They said they want to know why recommendations made by an interdepartmental panel are not being followed.

The committee at the same time made public the printed hearings covering the army's cancellation of a \$7,500,000 pilot plant for food irradiation which was to have been built near Stockton, Calif.

"We were pleased that our earlier hearings in January apparently succeeded in moving the department of the army to come up with some kind of a program. We want to find out however if there is really a firm satisfactory army program," the two legislators said.

They noted that the interdepartmental committee had recommended spending \$400,000 during the present fiscal year on a civilian irradiation program and \$200,000 in the fiscal year beginning July 1. In addition, construction of a

\$1,400,000 test center for irradiation was proposed.

The two legislators said that no plans have been made for the center and the operating budget has been scaled down to \$115,000 this year and \$500,000 next year. Some \$12,000,000 (M) has been spent over the years on preserving perishable food with nuclear radiation.

In the earlier hearings this year, army witnesses explained that they cancelled plans for the Stockton pilot-plant because the irradiation system is a costly preservative for most military establishments and because radiation, while it does not harm pork and poultry, causes a "taste change in beef and some other foods."

The army said additional experimentation should be devoted to diet studies which showed increased bleeding, sterility and heart ailments in some experimental animals eating irradiated foods. Other witnesses said the ailments could have been caused by the destruction of vitamins by the radiation and by other correctable diet deficiencies.
