Copco to Build New Buildings

A contract for phase IV construction in connection with the California Oregon Power company's Medford service center will be awarded Graff and James, box 82, Medford, Copco officials announced last week.

The Medford firm's bid was the lowest of seven bidders at \$318,000. This estimate includes all buildings, paving and other items. It is subject to adjustment for certain plan revisions which will further reduce the over-all construction costs, company officials said.

Bids for the project were opened Tuesday. It is a continuation of a program started last year when a central warehouse and shop buildings were constructed on the company's 17-acre site at Stewart ave. and Grape st.

The new contract will be for construction of a district office to house construction personnel and crews, a garage building and a covered truck storage area. Other work includes both blacktop and concrete paving, and provides a protective fence enclosing the area. Plans were prepared by the company's engineering staff.
