

Swimming Pool at Medford Y Reopens After Repair Work

The Medford YMCA swimming pool reopened Saturday after a three-week shut down for the first big change in its 11 years of operation.

Although the pool has been closed for painting, the changes include a new heating and ventilating system, new lighting, and acoustical treatment of the ceiling. Dwight Seeley has been the general contractor on the work, and Wayne Struble, Medford, the architect.

"To have this much needed renovation has been a goal of the YMCA aquatic committee for several years," Dr. William M. Roberts, YMCA aquatic chairman, said, "but funds were only recently available through the generosity of the late John R. Tomlin."

During the past 11 years, the pool has maintained the highest class A rating from the state sanitary engineer because of its filtration and management practices meeting the requirements.

It is the only heated indoor pool operating in the year around in southern Oregon or northern California, Dr. Roberts noted. Water temperature is kept at 78 degrees which is ideal for most swimmers.

The 77,000 gallon capacity tank was in perfect condition when drained. The sides or bottom of poured concrete showed no evidence of cracking or chipping, he said.

With the rapid growth of swimming and boating opportunities, the YMCA aquatic committee has concentrated on training special groups of persons with teaching and life saving skills, and, as a result, the majority of instruction at public pools and camps in the area have had the benefit of courses taught at the Medford YMCA pool in life saving, water safety, instructors and leader examiner courses using the Red Cross and YMCA materials.

Classes in scuba diving have also been popular recently since many persons now own this underwater breathing apparatus.

Training young persons for reliable leadership has been a chief aim of Dr. Roberts as he worked on the program, according to Robert L. Jones, YMCA secretary. Dr. Roberts has been assisted by Mrs. Lanell Wilkes, who has

directed a water safety aids group and teaches mothers and tots courses for pre-school children to become "water proofed" soon after they learn to walk.

The instructor with the most enviable record in the pool is August (Dutch) Farfan, who is now in his 10th year as a volunteer at the Y. He concentrates on teaching women to swim. His record of success is more than 1,500 women passing the beginners test who had never swum before.

Team Coach
Wilson Gilinsky, a senior at Southern Oregon college, who learned to swim at the YMCA at age 10, is the swimming team coach. This competitive team, called the "Dolphins," in the past two years, has hung up some enviable records and won more times than they have lost.

The Melvin Hess family has three members on the team. Linda, 16, has won 12 first places in backstroke and free style. Bruce, 14, has 8 first place honors in meets with butterfly breast stroke, and Rhonda, 11, has won several places. Rhonda concentrates on a dolphin kick with the butterfly breast stroke.

Two Appear in Circuit Court

Four From SOC To Get Foundation Awards

Ashland - Four members of the Southern Oregon college science-mathematics division have received awards from the National Science Foundation, Dr. Elliott B. MacCracken, head of the division at SOC, has announced.

James R. Dawson, assistant professor of science, received one of 300 Science Faculty Fellowships awarded by the NSF to provide an opportunity for college and university science teachers to enhance their effectiveness as teachers.

The fellowship will send Dawson to Oregon State college for a full year, beginning in June, to study plant physiology.

A. L. Siebenlist, assistant professor of mathematics, won a National Science Foundation stipend award to study at the University of Colorado under the NSF Academic Year Institute for teachers of science and mathematics. Siebenlist will leave in September.

Academic Year Institutes are designed and conducted by individual universities and colleges, aimed at increasing the competence of teachers by improving their knowledge of the subjects which they teach. About 1,500 teachers will be supported by the NSF as participants in this program during its fifth year, 1960-61.

Dr. Thomas M. Colasuonno, assistant professor of science, and Dr. Lloyd Pennington, professor of chemistry, both received National Science Foundation Summer Institute awards for study at Oregon State college. The Summer Institutes held on 381 college campuses are supported by grants from the National Science Foundation.
