**Heart Block**

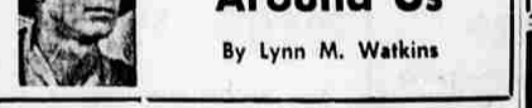
An occasional person writes wanting to know what heart block means—why he has it, and what it is likely to do to him. "Bundle branch" blocks are commonly found when a person has a routine electrocardiogram made. Usually, the person has no symptoms from such a block, and there is no treatment necessary. The defect is not likely to do him harm.

In the normal heart, the beat or contraction starts in a "node" in the upper part of one of the auricles (upper chambers) of the heart, near where the great veins, come in. From this node, a wave of contraction shoots rapidly along a pathway of special tissue called the bundle of His. When a branch leading off from this "bundle" to the heart muscle is injured or destroyed, perhaps by the plugging-up of a little artery, the person has a "bundle-branch block."

In some cases, the main bundle will be injured in such a way that the contraction takes an abnormally long time to get from the auricles to the ventricles. If the condition gets worse, every second or third beat fails to get through from the auricles above to the ventricles below. In the worst cases, the block is so complete that the ventricles have to beat on their own. Then the person may have a heart-beat of perhaps 45 per minute. In rare cases, when occasionally the ventricle fails to beat, the person will suffer a brief spell of unconsciousness due to an interruption in the flow of blood to his brain. This is called the Adams-Stokes syndrome.

Be Kind To The Lady-Bug—She Feeds on Scale Insects

There are literally millions of bugs we never see, and many of them don't even faintly resemble insects, either in appearance or actions. Such are the "scale insects" of which you probably have a goodly number in your own shrubs or trees, for they are everywhere.

They are called "scale insects" because they look more like flakes of scale than they do anything else, least of all like living, breathing, sucking bugs.

Take for example the "oyster-scale." These little pests resemble, both in color and general outline, the shell of the bivalve which lives in the sea. But they are very small, only about one twenty-fifth of an inch in length. The "cottony-scale" is another common one; looks like tiny tufts of cotton, scattered over the plant stem. The "snow-scale" looks much the same, only smaller if anything. These are found plentifully, at times, on hibiscus bushes.

the time sucking the juice from the plant. On plants where the infestation is extreme, the little domes are so numerous that they completely cover the bark. Ordinary sprays are ineffectual because of the waxy shell that covers the little bug, and protects him. In fact, it is exceedingly difficult to find a finger nail under the edge of the shell and pry upward.

Here is where our greatest benefactor among the insects gets in his best licks; the little spotted lady-bug, or lady-bird beetle, who walks slowly along the plant stems sucking from each little scale insect its lifeblood.

These are the same beetles that saved the California orange crop on several different occasions. If you see some of these little beetles on your plants, leave them alone, they are carrying the ball and they are playing on your team. (Released by The Register and Tribune Syndicate, 1960)
