## Downtown Miami Restaurant Quarters for Castro Backers

**Editor's note:** This is the third of three dispatches on Latin intrigue. This dispatch reports on the activity of the pro-Castro element in Miami.

Miami (UPI)—You get Cuban politics with your little cup of thick Cuban coffee at Paula's restaurant near downtown Miami.

Politics at Paula's is painted either black as the coffee or white as the table cloths. There is no middle ground. The Spanish words for politician and criminal are synonymous in the language of Paula's customers, and always applied to anyone who denounces Cuban Premier Fidel Castro.

A yellowing portrait of Castro—beardless—beams down as if in approval as Jose Paula, proprietor, speaks. "Why don't the newspapers tell what happens? Why don't they show what Fidel is doing? Why don't they say how Batista butchered the country?" Paula asked.

"Fidel is trying to get for Cuba what you have in this country. A nice living. Is that so bad?" Paula waved toward the picture as though inviting the premier to agree. The sweep of his hand also took in several bullet holes in the wall. **Aimed At Picture**

The bullets, from a .45 caliber pistol, smashed the glass front of Paula's restaurant last year. Apparently they were aimed at Castro's likeness. "Batista criminals," said Paula.

Paula's is one of the meeting places where 26th of July men met during the days when Fidel Castro's ragged rebels fought Batista's army in the Sierra Maestra Mountains. There are an estimated 100,000 Latins in Miami. About

50,000 of them are Cuban born or of Cuban descent. There is a large Colombian colony and the remainder are a mixture of Latin America. The Cuban Colony breaks down something like this: —The Batista faction which fled Cuba in the wake of the Castro revolution. U. S. Immigration once estimated this group at 350 to 400 persons, but it probably is bigger now.

—The neutral Cubans, non-political, making up the great majority. Most of these were anti-Batista but many have cooled on Castro.

—The active Castro supporters and 26th of July members, numbering around 700. —The anti-Trujillo group, probably less than 100, actively working with the sympathy of the Castro supporters to unseat the Dominican Republic strongman, Rafael Trujillo.

**New Group Formed**

To this breakdown can now be added the "united" exile front being organized by exiled Cuban businessman, Francisco Cajigas. Only Cajigas and his associates know the number of their supporters. "Cajigas is just trying to swindle the people who are giving him money," said Eduardo L. Blanco, the Castro-appointed Cuban consul general in Miami.

"We will give the Cajigas people guns, bazookas, hand grenades and tanks and anything else . . . and we will fight them with just machetes . . . and we will win."

The most publicized underground activity in Miami of late, since gun-running subsided, has been illegal leaflet-dropping and fire-bombing flights over Cuba. These flights have been sponsored by various anti-Castro elements.

But the 26th of July movement agents are still busy. Recently, the FBI smashed a plot by Cuban secret police to kidnap former Sen. Roland Masferrer from Miami and return him to Cuba to face revolutionary justice. Masferrer was a senator and Batista's right-hand man.

The FBI was tipped that Cuban agents were seeking a Florida law officer with an itchy palm to help in the kidnap plot. An undercover FBI agent passed himself off as a Dade county deputy sheriff and leaked the word he was for hire.

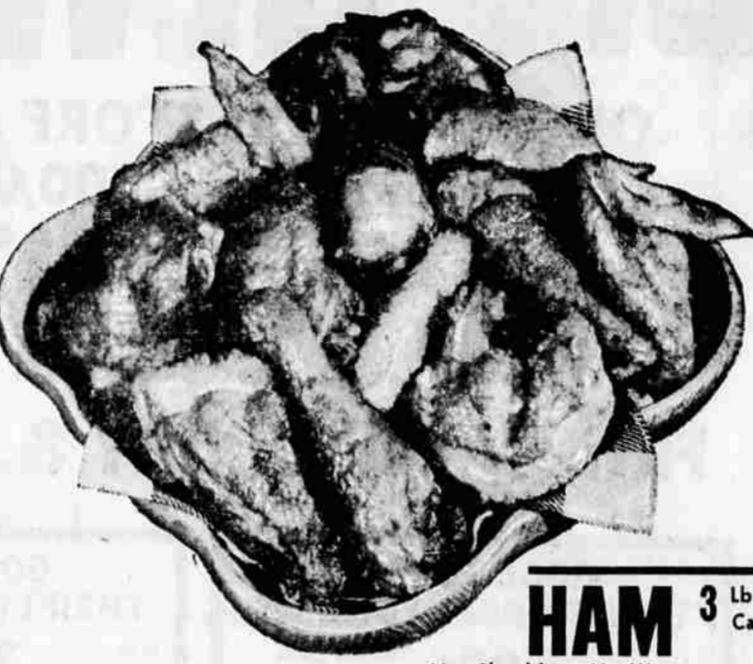
The Cubans instructed their "deputy" to arrest Masferrer on a trumped-up charge. They would have a boat waiting on Key Biscayne to whisk Masferrer to Cuba. The FBI arrested the Cubans as they paid the pseudo-deputy in advance.

Even the redoubtable Maj. William Morgan, the American lieutenant of Castro, slipped in and out of Miami in 1959. He was baiting the trap in which a band of anti-Castro conspirators flew from the Dominican Republic to Cuba into the arms of Castro's soldiers.

Occasionally opposing political elements clash right in the streets of Miami. But the last such incident brought stern warnings from Miami authorities.
