The Medical Roundup

Psychiatric Theories Shattered
One of the most distressing things that has happened lately to some psychoanalysts has been their discovery that the arm-chair theories of insanity which, for 40 years, they have lived by and worked with now appear to be inadequate.

For years, all of us have been reading in analytic literature their theory that insanity is due to sexual injuries sustained by the person.

As I was writing this, I picked up a review of a book on Social Psychotherapy by Drs. Jules Masserman and J. L. Moreno and found these words, quoted from the Preface: "By 1958 the Zeitgeist (spirit of the time) in psychiatry had definitely turned from theoretic fictions about the private fantasies of the isolated individual to the infinitely richer and more productive historical, social and cultural contents of all behavior."

Since then, chemists have been finding one drug after another—drugs with which the research type of psychiatrist can produce a psychosis at will. Just now I found an article by Dr. Max Rinkel and his colleagues, C. R. Atwell, A. D. Mascio, and J. Brown, in which they describe a remarkable new chemical called psilocybine which, in tiny doses, will quickly produce in healthy volunteers most of the symptoms of an insane person.

Obviously, the discovery of all these drugs strongly suggests that, instead of psychoses being produced by the weird and improbable, and much-advertised ideas of the psychoanalysts, they are being produced by chemical changes in the patient's body or brain—changes that are brought about perhaps by hereditary defects in the body chemistry—defects much like those which produce diabetes and gout and hardening of the arteries.

Another fact that has staggered the analysts and wrecked their theories is that one can often bring a woman right out of a bad mental depression and cure her—not by five years of making her talk every day about her child-hood sexual fantasies—but simply by a week's treatment with four or five electroshocks.
