All girls will issue invitations to their secret dads.

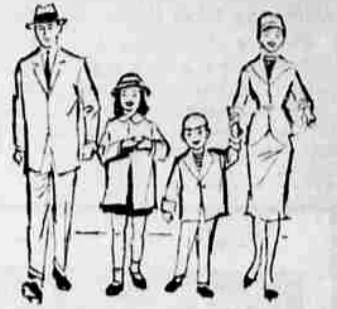

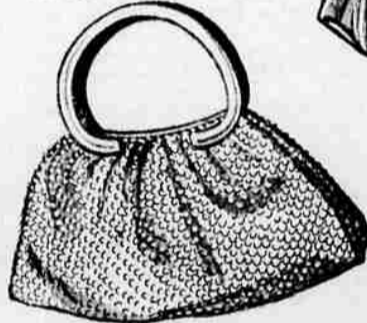
