SO Raider Athletes In Week End Action

Ashland - Sports festivities on the South Oregon college campus reign supreme this week end when the Raider baseball crew takes on Oregon College of Education in a single game Friday and a doubleheader Saturday and the Raider track team will host Chico State at 1:30 p.m. Saturday.

The Raider golf team will be in the Northern California Intercollegiate Invitational meet at Paso Tiempo, and the tennis team in Portland competing against Portland State.

Coach Ted Schopf's hard-hitting baseball crew will open its Oregon Collegiate conference defense against Coach Bob Livingston's Wolves at 3 p.m. in the Friday game.

Lefthander John Younger has drawn the starting role in the single game Friday with righthander Don Vannice and lefty Marty Vogler scheduled for the twin-bill beginning at 10 a.m. Saturday.

First baseman and pitcher Jack Brown was missed from practice in the early part of the week with a case of the flu. In the event Brown still has not recuperated, Bob Jones will get the starting spot at first.

Last year the Raider walloped the Wolves three times in Monmouth, Oregon College opened the OCC season last week end with a doubleheader against Portland State. The teams split.

Jim Dietz will lead off the starting lineup and play shortstop.

Cage Classic Site Changed

Eugene - The Far West Basketball Classic, a fixture at Oregon State college since its inception, will be played at Portland's Memorial Coliseum this year, it was announced today by Leo Harris and Spec Keene, athletic directors at Oregon and OSC.

The eight-team affair will be played Dec. 28-29-30, with Oregon and OSC acting as co-hosts.

The 1960 field again will include Oregon, Oregon State, Portland, Washington State and Idaho. The three new teams entered will be Seattle, Arizona State and Wisconsin.

Ed Sawyer Quits; Mauch Heads Phils

Philadelphia - Eddie Sawyer, 49, unexpectedly resigned today as manager of the Philadelphia Phillies and was succeeded by Gene Mauch.

The news was announced at a hurriedly summoned press conference by President Bob Carpenter.

Mauch, 33, has been manager of the Minneapolis Millers, a Boston Red Sox farm in the American association. Sawyer returned as Phils

manager in July, 1958. The club finished last under his leadership in 1959, but that season was written off as one in which the Phils were experimenting largely with younger players.

The same policy was in effect this season. The Phils generally were picked to finish last in the National League race.

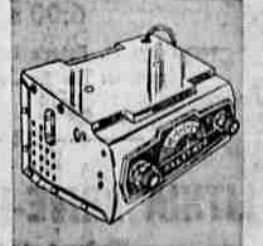
