Anxiety Seen as Cause of False Bomb Reports

Washington—(Science Service)—“It was only joking.” That is what some airline passengers said of their comments that there might be a bomb on their planes or in their luggage.

Unfortunately, the “joke” has been pulled by more than one or two persons—the total has reached several hundred, according to an assistant in the office of J. Edgar Hoover, Federal Bureau of Investigation director. It is not funny.

It is no joke to FBI agents who have had to check out each of the “kidding” remarks. It is no joke to the airlines who have had to turn back planes and make fruitless searches.

Mental Mechanism

Psychologists see in such a wildfire spreading of false bomb reports a mental mechanism like that causing the spread of false rumors. Fear is the driving force that causes the spread of rumors. What set off bomb reports was the occurrence of actual cases of explosion of bombs carried aboard by passengers.

The seed of such a fear must fall on fertile ground to take root and spread. This means that the airline traveling public must already have been in an anxious state of mind in order for the bomb fear and false reports to spread.

Not Closely Related

The anxiety may not be closely related to flying. It may be due to the tensions resulting from the Cold War, or uneasy international relations, or fear of racial unrest in the South.

FBI officials have resolved that the wildfire of false reports must be brought to a stop. They are building a backbone by arresting the “jokers.” Among the very first persons arrested, one was an advertising executive. This caused some persons to suspect that he was trying a “publicity stunt.” FBI officials believe, however, that the “jokers” represent a cross-section of the American public. Certainly they are not all advertising or publicity men.

Officials Swamped With Pictures From Tiros 1

Washington—(Science Service)—Tiros 1 continues to demonstrate that a system of half a dozen or so satellites could warn of storms brewing anywhere in the world, officials of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration indicate.

But there is a bottleneck: About 100 NASA, Weather Bureau and Air Force personnel, some working 15-hour days, are swamped by the more than thousand pictures already radioed back from Tiros I, the TV cloud-watching satellite.

Proved Possible

One NASA official said that putting a useful set of satellites into the air has been proved possible by Tiros. However, a system for quickly analyzing the pictures produced must be built.

The slowness in analyzing pictures from Tiros 1 does not really matter, he said, because Tiros 1 is not a storm warning system but an experiment.

Tiros' pictures must be painstakingly correlated with ground data so meteorologists can say that such a cloud pattern means a certain kind of weather on the earth below.

After this correlation, quick weather predictions may be possible. The analysis problem is not a small one.

Though they are working overtime, meteorologists with the Tiros project are pleased. Tiros has produced weather data over oceans where information has been scanty or non-existent.

Land Masses Revealed

A special showing of pictures for newsmen revealed the outlines of Spain, Mallorca, the St. Lawrence estuary, Italy, Corsica and similar large land masses.

Tiros' TV pictures have 500 scanning lines. In the pictures of areas 800 miles on a side, each line would represent a strip of land about one and one-half miles wide. In the 80-mile wide pictures, each line represents a strip about a sixth of a mile wide.

The camera can distinguish between white clouds and dark ground and can even distinguish the lighter colors of the shoals around the Bahamas, but not much more.

The camera can not photograph stars. But NASA may try for a picture of the moon.

A Voice After Laryngectomy For Cancer

Many physicians will be interested, as I was, in an article by Sen. Thomas C. Desmond, of Albany, N. Y., in "Today's Health," on the way in which persons without a larynx (voice box) was removed for cancer) are able to talk, and to go on earning their living. For years at Mayo's, persons who have lost their larynx have been able to speak well with the help of an apparatus, one end of which fits into the hole in the neck, and the other end which is held between the lips, where the emerging sounds are modified sonatorily by the person.

Senator Desmond describes the type of speech now used by most laryngectomized persons. With this, the man partially swallows some air and then belches it up past the upper entrance to the gullet, where a certain muscle is made to vibrate. The sound thus produced is then shaped into words by the person's tongue, teeth and lips. There are several places in the United States where a patient without a larynx can receive the training that will enable him to speak well.

On Avoiding Mix-Ups in the Obstetric Department

In a big hospital where several mothers are having babies—perhaps at the same time—every care is now taken to avoid the possibility of sending a woman home with a baby not her own. A fairly recent article in "Today's Health" tells of all the many precautions that are now taken to identify each baby immediately after he or she is born. Often, now, prints are promptly made of the baby's feet—prints like the "finger prints" that have been used for years by the police. A print of the mother's right index finger probably will be made on the infant's record. Then plastic tags will be placed on the baby's wrist and ankle. The mother also may wear a similar tag. In addition, a picture may be taken of the baby. If all these precautions are taken while the mother and baby are still together, right after the baby's birth, there cannot be much chance of error.

A while ago, while chatting with Sir Archibald McIndoe, the great plastic surgeon of England, he was telling about a woman who, some 12 years before, in a European hospital gave birth to identical twins. On going home, she
