Rabies, or Hydrophobia
Rabies is still a very frightening disease which ought to be fought more actively in the next few years. Curiously, although this terrible infection has killed as many as 8,000 dogs in a year, many people who say they love dogs have done everything they could to block the efforts of their health authorities to vaccinate and protect and for a while keep indoors all the dogs in a district in which the dread disease had become epidemic. Always it is highly important that rabies be quickly wiped out in dogs because, when it isn't wiped out, the disease spreads to wild animals such as foxes, skunks, and bats. Naturally, once this happens, the disease cannot be gotten at.

Fortunately, in recent years, a new type of anti-rabies vaccine has been made — a vaccine which is much easier to take than is the old 14-shot Pasteur treatment. It is a good idea to give this new vaccine to pups soon after they are born. As I must keep saying in this column, if anyone is attacked and bitten by a stray dog, it is extremely important that someone follow the animal until it can either be captured and impounded or shot. Then, either the animal can be watched for some days to see if it is rabid, or the brain can be examined for the typical changes of rabies. If the dog cannot be caught and examined, then the person bitten may have to undergo a treatment which can be unpleasant and slightly dangerous.

I was just reading how, during 1958, in Indianapolis and its surrounding county, 2,800 animal bites were reported. Two-thirds of the victims were children. I am happy to read in the report of Dr. F. Bruce Peek, Jr., that, with all the many vaccinations that had to be given, there were no unfortunate results.

Chances For Aged
They tell me that when a man retires at 65 he has two out of three chances of living on to 75, and he has one in four chances of getting to 85. As I showed recently, if through no fault of his a man of 45 or 50 loses his job, his chances of finding employment again are slim.
