**Disappointed By Short Letter**  
I can well imagine that many people are greatly disappointed at not getting an answer to a letter sent to me; and some must be disappointed at getting only a brief answer to their long letter full of questions. Even if I had nothing else to do, I could hardly read and answer even 100 letters in a day; actually, my days are always very busy. I have so many other jobs just to keep reading enough of the enormous literature of advancing medicine so that I can keep up-to-date for the writing of this column.

As I have said, it distresses me not to be able always to answer letters that come from you good readers, but even with several able women helping me, I cannot do it. Before I could give an answer of any value to hundreds of the people who write me I would have to have immensely more information than the person has been able to send me. Usually, I would have to talk to the person for an hour and then have him well examined. To give just one illustration, here come to my desk a letter from a man who asks me if he should have his ruptures operated on, and will he get a good result? How can I answer? I don't know how old he is; or in what physical and mental condition, or how well he is getting along with a truss, or how physically strenuous his job is, or how big his ruptures are, or if they have been operated on before, or if he is in fit shape to stand an anesthetic, and so on and so on.

Another letter is from a woman who says she has "female trouble"; another has "catarrh," and another has a "backache." How can I guess what is wrong with them? I just must not try.

**What is Gastroscopy?**  
Some people have asked if they should have their stomachs looked into with a long electrically lighted tube called a gastroscope. I rarely ask a patient to submit to such an examination, and then do it because, after careful examination of the stomach with x-rays, there still is a question as to just what was seen. Was it an ordinary ulcer that might heal with diet, or was it a beginning cancer? Sometimes an expert gastroscopist can tell, and sometimes even he cannot be sure. Then the patient has to be operated on to make sure.

**Scientists Work on Element Discovery**  
Berkeley, Calif. — (Science Service) — Scientists here hope to be able to create element 103 before the end of April.

Dr. Albert Ghiorso of the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory here told Science Service that discovery of the new element was only "a question of time." The University of California scientists who have discovered many of the transuranium elements of the atomic age believe they will succeed shortly in making another one, which will then be the heaviest known.

He said the California team had been trying to make element 103 for the past few months, and hope to announce its discovery at a meeting in Gatlinburg, Tenn., the first week in May. The method consists in bombarding a target element in such atom smashers as the Berkeley HILAC.
