

# Most Killers Said To Have Infantile Disregard for Life

New York — (Science Service) — Most murderers are committed by persons who are not mentally ill, but who have an abnormal or infantile disregard for human life. This is the conclusion of Dr. Manfred S. Guttman in a new book, "The Mind of the Murderer," published here.

Dr. Guttman, a teacher of psychiatry at Johns Hopkins University and the University of Maryland, is in private practice of psychiatry and for 25 years has been chief medical officer to the Supreme Bench of Baltimore.

Of 175 cases studied by Dr. Guttman, 53 of the murderers were mentally ill, 105 were clearly not psychotic and 17 were seriously abnormal but a psychosis at the time of the crime could not be definitely established.

**Clear Differences**

A number of clear differences between the insane murderer and those who were not psychotic are cited by Dr. Guttman. Nearly every murderer committed by an insane individual is preceded by some signs of insanity. A third of Dr. Guttman's group had previous institutionalization for mental illness.

Victims of the insane killer are generally intimate associates, frequently his own children. Most insane killers show no remorse and freely confess. The motives they give seem completely inadequate to a sane person.

The crimes of an insane killer are generally extremely bloody. The crime of the sane killer is not well planned; he often kills with whatever object he can pick up and in full view of onlookers. Only one-fifth of the mentally ill murderers had a record of previous convictions for assault or serious criminal offense while two-fifths of the non-psychotic group had such convictions.

**Had No Memory**

More than at third of the mentally ill murderers had no memory of the crime or had only partial memory. This was rare among the non-psychotic unless the perpetrator was dead drunk at the time.

In addition to the "normal" murderer, Dr. Guttman lists other types:

1. Sociopathic. This type of individual has been called "a rebel without cause." He wages a war against society. One of those studied by Dr. Guttman had "achieved the unenviable distinction of expulsion from kindergarten."
2. Alcoholic. There are two ways in which alcohol may lead to murder. Murders have been committed by persons with acute alcoholic delirium while defending themselves against the creatures of their own diseased imaginations. But more often alcohol unleashes suppressed and repressed aggressions. Some individuals become involved in crime only when drinking.
3. Avenging. In many murders the victim is a desecrating wife, husband or sweetheart, but sometimes the attack upon the hated-and-loved person is indirect by destruction of something or someone held dear by that person.
4. Schizophrenic. Most psychotic murderers are schizophrenic. One of the dominant characteristics of the schizophrenic, says Dr. Guttman, is his hostility which often reaches murderous proportions.
5. Temporarily psychotic. Yes, it actually happens sometimes that a person may be insane at the time of the crime and sane before and afterwards. Examination of this type of murderer showed that they had a history of lack or loss of control of aggressive impulses. In fact many had reported their fear that they would lose control to the police or to psychiatrists before the murder took place.

# Stretched Rope Contributed To End of Hangings

St. Paul, Minn. — (UP) — A stretched hangman's rope and a 300-pound sheriff contributed to the abolition of capital punishment in Minnesota.

But just as in the California furor over capital punishment and the life of Caryl Chessman, the passions of the people played a vital role in the debate over ending the death penalty.

**Last Execution in 1906**

The state's last execution took place Feb. 13, 1906. The condemned man was William F. Williams, sentenced to death for the murder of a St. Paul woman and her young son.

Several persons gathered in the basement of the county jail in St. Paul to watch the execution, Williams, swearing he was innocent, was escorted up the 13 steps of the gallows and stopped atop the steel trap door.

The trap was sprung and Williams dropped. There was a sharp crack and cries of horror came from the crowd.

The rope was too long. Williams' feet were on the floor.

Three deputies on the gallows grabbed the rope and pulled it enough to suspend Williams in the air.

He struggled. It took 14½ minutes for the condemned man to die.

**Rope Stretched**

As the story has passed down through the years, the deputy sheriff who had measured the hangman's rope had done an accurate job.

But a few days before the hanging, Sheriff Anton Mieson was showing some friends how strong the rope was by swinging on it.

Meisen weighed about 300 pounds.

By swinging on the rope, the story goes, Mieson stretched it enough so that the condemned man's feet hit the floor instead of stopping him in mid-air and breaking his neck.

Newspaper accounts of the bungled hanging sparked a sharp public outcry for an end to capital punishment. It took the legislature five years to repeal it, but there were no executions in Minnesota during that period.

**Can Get Life**

The fact that Minnesota does not have capital punishment, however, does not mean that murderers are treated with leniency. They can get life imprisonment, and a lifer in Minnesota spends on the average more time behind bars than in other states.

The average length of time served by lifers before they can be released on parole is about 14 years. In Minnesota a lifer without a record can not apply for parole unless he has served 17 years. If he has a prior felony conviction, he isn't eligible until he's been in prison 23 years.

# Humphrey Predicts U.S. To Drift Into Weakness Position

Washington — (UP) — Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn.) has predicted that the United States will drift into "a very serious position of weakness" unless it steps up its defenses or speeds fruitful disarmament efforts.

"I feel that we're able to defend ourselves for the moment. But it's the long period of time, the next two, three, five years that disturbs me," Humphrey said. He is an avowed candidate for the Democratic Presidential Nomination.

In a discussion with Sen. George A. Smathers (D-Fla.) Humphrey expressed concern over what he called the "pathetic" scope of U.S. disarmament efforts and the lack of preparation for disarmament conferences.

He said that next year the U.S. position, especially as to missiles and rockets, will be "less advantageous" unless something is done to step up those programs.

"Unless we step up activities or are able to get some disarmament, we're going to find ourselves in a very serious position of weakness," said Humphrey. He described transport facilities, mobile forces and arms "inadequate" for small scale police actions.

**Sex Hormone Barometer May Detect Cancer**

Louisville, Ky. — (Science Service) — A "sex hormone barometer" that could measure the productivity of the sex glands and serve as a warning against the development of breast cancer has been described here.

Cancer of the breast, the most common of all human cancers, might some day be controlled if each sex hormone could be identified and its role in the human body determined. Then it might be possible to measure the levels of these hormones and control the amount of each so that the tumors would be deprived of the exact amounts of each needed for their growth.

**Big 'Promoters'**

Steroids, the hormones secreted by the sex glands, are big "promoters" in the development of breast cancer in humans, Dr. Thomas L. Dao of Roswell Park Memorial Institute, Buffalo, told a science writers' seminar here. All breast cancers need this hormonal environment for their growth. This does not mean, however, that hormones are the cause of breast cancer, he cautioned.

His studies with rats revealed they developed breast cancer in a manner similar to humans. For instance, when rats with breast cancer became pregnant, their tumors grew more rapidly because of the abundance of steroids being produced during pregnancy. On the other hand, the breast cancers tend to grow smaller or more infrequently after pregnancy, when steroid production is reduced.

**Ovaries Transplanted**

Dr. Dao injected male rats with a substance known to cause tumors, 3-methylcholanthrene. Only one per cent of these rats developed mammary cancers. He then transplanted to them the ovaries from their sisters. Breast cancer developed in 60 per cent of these males.

He also discovered that if the cancer-causing substance is injected into rats after they become pregnant, the number of tumors that form is considerably smaller than the number that form when the injected rats are not pregnant.

Thus, pregnancy appears to protect the rats from developing breast cancer. Since this is also the case with women, Dr. Dao believes this avenue of investigation may be a fruitful one in the near future.

# Added Territorial Sea Claims Subject Of Conference Talk

Geneva — (UP) — A struggle between the old and the new is heading for a showdown in the former League of Nations headquarters overlooking Lake Geneva.

The waters of the lake, which can be quite rough at times, are peaceful now. But others waters around the world, from the Arctic to the Antarctic, are the subject of a legal battle that has been under way for one month.

This legal battle can decide how wide a belt of coastal water any state may claim.

The old Law of the Sea, the three-mile limit, is dying if it is not already dead. Only one-third of the world's coastal states still recognize it.

**Wider Call**

For along with the growth of new states and the swelling of populations has come a call for wider territorial seas, where the coastal states may claim exclusive fishing right.

There are other factors involved, including prestige. A new state wants as much control of its coastal waters as it can get. There is a defense factor. Some states believe that a wide territorial sea means more protection.

There is the Arab desire to close the Gulf of Aqaba and block Israel's sea door to Asia.

And each country is determined to get what it can at the U.N. Law of the Sea Conference, now heading into its final phase.

Ranged against the growing cry for more coastal waters are the traditional maritime states and their supporters. For them, the width of the territorial sea has little defense meaning.

**Common Property**

They see the world's oceans as common property, and champion freedom of the seas. But they realized two years ago that the world community would never give a two-thirds majority vote to the old regime, so they agreed to an extension to six miles.

Even that offer failed to win approval.

Now the six-mile group, headed by the United States and Canada, is trying once again. And this time it has made a further offer:

# Cuban Has Plan To Carry Out Warfare Against Castro

Miami — (UP) — The 29-year-old exiled Cuban accountant who delivered an ultimatum of war to Fidel Castro lives in a three-room cottage and works as a waiter in a Miami Beach hotel.

He is Fernando Lopez del Toro. He has a wife, a child, and limitless confidence.

"The plans is easy," he said in fairly good English. "We have more than 5,000 men ready inside Cuba to start the war. They are ready in six provinces and they will all start at once. I will be there to help them."

Lopez' ultimatum, a duplicated legal-size sheet of white paper, was circulated in Miami Monday. He said copies were smuggled into Cuba and that a 19-year-old volunteer, Elmo Martinez Garcia, was supposed to deliver it to Castro in Havana.

The ultimatum served notice on Castro to purge his government of Communist influence or face internal war starting May 2.

Lopez calls his movement the Cuban Anti-Communist Army.

"Others who say they are anti-Castro are nothing," he said. By others the meant men like Francisco Cajigas and Pedro Diaz Lenz, both of whom have announced the formation of anti-Castro organizations.

"They just talk about it," said Lopez. "I mean to do something."

Lopez said he has always been anti-Castro. "Even when I was at the university of Havana. I knew he was not right for Cuba. He was too far left," with the Reds.

Lopez came to Miami as Castro marched into Havana. Since then, he said, he has been exhorting Cubans to buy weapons for the "war from within."

He said there are now enough arms — mostly pistols, rifles and Thompson submachine guns — to fight a successful war.

"We will hit and run and wear the Communists out," said Lopez. "We will use the same tactics Fidel used against Batista."

# Art Class Boring; Man Hospitalized

New York — Jesse R. Wirt, 31, should have stiffed that yawn.

He stretched so prodigiously in yawning that he dislocated his right shoulder and had to be hospitalized.

The yawn came when Wirt was attending a class in modern art. Wirt is an art teacher, himself.
