'Oklahoma' Given Long, Loud Applause At First Staging

Judging by the long and loud applause, the large audience thoroughly enjoyed the opening performance of "Oklahoma," given last night at the Medford High school auditorium.

The high school production of this popular Rodgers and Hammerstein music was directed in its entirety by Lynn Sjolund of the school faculty. It was sponsored by the school choir.

Taken as a whole, the director and student cast have turned out a good production. Barbara Tyler and John Frohnmayer, the romantic leads, both have good voices and engaging stage personalities, and the well-trained chorus adds much to the performance. A school orchestra played the overture and part of the accompaniments. Mary Williams, pianist and Judy Carver, organist, were the principal accompanists.

The costumes, keyed to the turn of the century in the "Indian Territory" are bright and colorful, the sets are good and the excellent lighting adds considerably to the dramatic impact, particularly in the featured dance numbers. Miss Colleen Hope served as choreographer for the dances, and trained the dancers.

Effective Performance
Keith Berg gave an effective performance as Jud Fry, the "villain" and one of the best scenes of last night's production was that between young Frohnmayer and Berg in the "Pore Jud" number.

In a musical, comedy is almost more important than the romance and last night the honors for comedy roles went to the girls. Rosalind Randles as the loud but kindly Aunt Eller, Sara Hinkle as the gay Ada Annie "who couldn't say no" and Kathy Allen as giggling Gertie Cummings added dash and flavor.

Jim Lacy was cast as Will

Parker, Annie's persistent suitor, Ken Hall played All Hakim, the improbable foreign peddler, Ralph Lobdell was Slim, Bill Rupp played Fred and Wally Huffman, Ike Skidmore.

Ballet Numbers
In the ballet numbers, Sharon Laing danced the role of Laurey and Mike Gardner that of Curly. John Lacy was Jud, and Carolyn Knoll danced the role of the young girl.

The closing scene of "Oklahoma" is especially effective, with the newly-married Curly and Laurey pulled from the stage in an old buggy with bright yellow wheels.

Two roles were double cast. Tonight Janet Myhre will be seen at Laurey and Linda Samuelson as Ado Annie. Saturday night Miss Tyler and Miss Hinkle return to the cast. We hope that Director Sjolund succeeds in speeding the two remaining performances of the show; three hours is too long, even for a musical.

Curtain time is 8 p.m. and all seats in the auditorium are reserved.—O.S.
