From Salem:
Money to construct a transportation building on the Capitol Mall will be asked from the 1961 legislature, according to State Finance Director Freeman Holmer. Actually the building would be self-financed through rentals paid by the departments occupying it.
Principal tenant of the building would be the state Department of Motor Vehicles, which now is occupying a privately-owned building in North Salem. The lease on this building expires in 1964. Holmer said he hoped the building would be completed before the expiration of the lease.
