

Man Takes Blame For Ballot Goo

Portland - (AP) - A Portland attorney, George Halley, has taken the blame for an error which appeared in the official voter's pamphlet for the May 20 primary election.

Halley said that in an article explaining the ballot measure to increase legislators' salaries, there is a statement that California pays its legislators \$800 a year - instead of the correct sum of \$600.

He said he was a member of the committee which prepared the article and said he researched that particular point and a typographical error occurred in the finished statement in his office.

Saturday Anniversary Of Nazi Chief's Suicide

Berlin - (AP) - The Communists have plowed up Adolf Hitler's bunker and maybe the remains of the Nazi dictator with it.

Fifteen years ago Saturday at about 2:30 a.m. Hitler shot himself and Eva Braun, his wife, in a Berlin bunker.

They killed themselves in the air raid bunker of the chancellery on Wilhelm Strasse. Not even a small bunker of the bunker now remains but grass is beginning to sprout there on what is believed to be their graves.

The chancellery itself from which Hitler ruled almost all of Europe was blown up by the Russians 13 years ago. They blew up the bunker, too, but a gigantic jagged boulder remained to mark the site and remind tourists and Germans alike of the Fuehrer's end.

Hitler's charred bones and those of his wife still are there, if the testimony of former Nazis can be believed.

There are some who insist Hitler did not kill himself and that somehow he escaped from the Red army ring of steel only blocks away from the bunker.

Since the war, rumor has placed him in every corner of the world but Israel.

But the West Berlin Allied intelligence experts went into this matter very thoroughly. They were convinced of the truth of the story of the bunker suicide.

The Nazis who stayed with Hitler to the end confirm the intelligence reports and they

appear to be telling the truth. There is, however, a difference of expert opinion on Hitler's last resting place.

Some experts say the Russians exhumed Hitler's remains and removed them to the Soviet Union.

But Hitler's former valet, Heinz Linge, denies this. He says "his" ashes were buried by the SS elite troops in a common grave near the chancellery.

Linge said he knows because he says he himself poured 50 gallons of gasoline on "his" body and set it afire so it would not be mutilated as Mussolini's was.

Linge tries to avoid mentioning Hitler's name. In discussing Hitler he says "he" and "him."

"The Russians had all the bodies exhumed, but I know they never found his because they questioned me repeatedly about it," he said.

But is Hitler still remembered? Millions of German adults can still recite: "Our leader, Adolf Hitler, was born April 20, 1889, in the town of Braunau am Inn."

"He received the Iron Cross in the World War because he captured single handed 16 Frenchmen later he was... They learned this by heart at the age of six in school when children in other nations were learning the "Little Red Riding Hood."
