Mrs. Betty Beach, Portland, president of the Oregon Association for Nursery Education, spoke to the group.

Mrs. Beach stressed the advantages to be gained from such an association and stated that more Oregon members were now affiliated with the national organization than in any other state. She outlined the programs provided monthly in Portland and told of the bi-annual work shops for all members in the state.

Aims and purposes of the association are to provide opportunities for all those working with pre-school children, either professionally or on a volunteer basis, to come together for discussion, learning and observation.
