Uses of Hypnotism

I recently heard a lecture by Dr. Seymour Herschman of Chicago, who is an expert on the subject of hypnotism. He discussed the subject with what sounded to me like much good sense, he said, in the first place, that the hypnotized person is not asleep. He is really awake, but he has closed his eyes and ears to outside distractions. Accordingly, Dr. Herschman thinks he can concentrate better on what is being told him than a normal person. An electroencephalogram, which consists of the tiny electric currents constantly forming in the brain, will show that the man is not asleep. He may seem drowsy and dreamy, but he can feel, and he can sense everything going on about him.

There is no absolute surrender of his will. He will accept only those orders which he is willing to carry out. According to Dr. Herschman, the hypnotist cannot make people do anything they don't want to do—commit a criminal act for example. For good hypnosis, the patient must cooperate with the doctor. Actually, Dr. Herschman says that a person who wants to derive much help from hypnosis should learn by repeated experience how to go into the hypnotic state. Eventually, a man can get good at it, and quick at it.

Won't Reveal Secrets

He need never fear that his mind will be weakened by it. Also, a hypnotized person will not give away secrets. There need be no fear that the person won't wake up after a hypnotic trance. Dr. Herschman has gathered records of over half a million hypnotic experiences, and in no case was the patient unable to wake up when told to do this. Dr. Herschman feels that there is no danger in hypnosis, but he doesn't like to see it carried out on a stage for the amusement of an audience.

The doctor thinks there are several main uses for hypnosis. One is for the alleviation of fears and apprehensions; another is for the control of pain. About a hundred years ago in India, Dr. Esdaile reported having performed 300 operations on people whom he had put into the hypnotic state. Nowadays hypnosis is being used in some operations. It enables the anesthetist to give less ether. Also, the patient "goes under" with less apprehension and fear. This is good in cases of children.

Dr. Herschman feels that hypnosis is something like that which all of us have toward our wrist-watch or our rings, the glasses on our nose, or the plates in our mouth. We don't feel them at all; we don't even know if they are there.

The doctor says one can quickly teach 95 per cent of persons to feel what is called a glove area of anesthesia, which includes the whole hand and wrist. Later, one can teach the person to feel anesthesia in larger areas. In the cases of women in labor, when hypnotized they can get by with half the usual amount of anesthesia.

Hypnotism can be used in helping people to overcome a bad habit, such as heavy smoking, over-eating, wetting the bed, stuttering, grinding the teeth, or having tics or habit-spasms. Some of these persons can be helped.

Can Relax Better
 Sometimes a person with an ulcer of the stomach can be helped. With hypnotism one can teach people to relax better. With hypnotism, a tense person may be able to get along each day with only half his usual dosage of tranquilizers. Obviously, with a person in a hypnotic trance, the doctor can give strong sugges-

tions. Hypnosis can be used in psychiatry, in those cases in which an experienced psychiatrist thinks it might work. Usually, the psychiatrist uses this method in addition to other techniques.

Dr. Herschman says there are only a few places in the country, such as Tufts College in Boston and Marquette University in Milwaukee, where they have a good course in hypnosis. He feels that because there are so many different specialties in which hypnosis can be used, the art ought to be taught by several different specialists working together. He said that there is no way of prophesying which persons will be easy to hypnotize and which won't, but he thinks all but a few people can learn to be hypnotized.

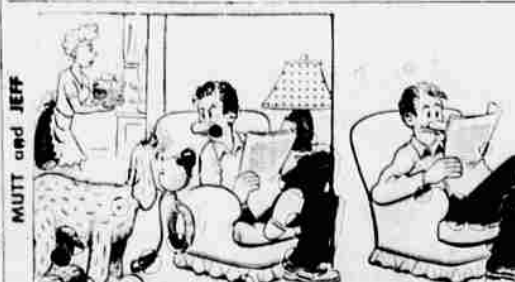
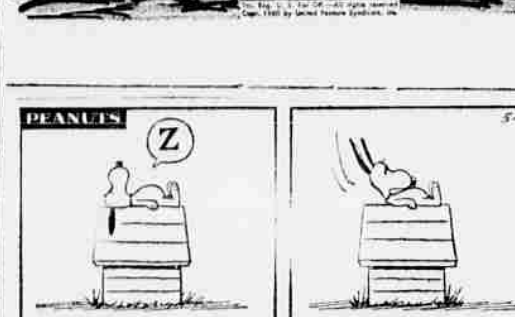
