harmless bird, was killed by thousands on northern shores, for the morbid satisfaction of seeing it thresh among its fellows when hit with a club. The last one was seen in the year 1852, and no living specimen has ever been found since. The Labrador duck, unfortunate enough to be palatable to human taste, was killed by every means that could be devised. Some held on to a precarious life until 1875. None have been seen since then.

The Eskimo curlew was hunted so persistently that the species could not continue. Here the human destroyers even gathered the eggs, along with the birds, until the inevitable end came in complete and total annihilation.

Great Crimes

In 1914 the last passenger pigeon on this earth died in a zoo. This lone survivor, the only remnant of flocks of birds that darkened the sun, worried out the last days of its life in a cage. The slaughter of these birds was one of the greatest crimes ever perpetrated upon a helpless creature. They were killed by every means at the disposal of greedy men.

The birds were left to rot on the ground, killed only because human beings thirsted for blood, and stupidly believed the supply of birds was inexhaustible.

Martha's Vineyard marks the final stand of the heath hen. The last one died in 1932, while friends of the bird were trying to find a mate for it; but they had waited too long. The whooping crane and the trumpeter swan are still struggling precariously on the very brink of extinction. A few remain, but their position is far from secure.
