Portlanders Blast Tacoma Giants 5-0

The Seattle Rainiers, the hottest club on the grapefruit circuit this spring, today have more wins than defeats for the first time since the young Pacific Coast league season got underway.

Seattle, which was 16-4, in exhibition play, climbed above .500 per cent Sunday with an explosive, 9-4, victory over San Diego, Jerry Zimmerman and Lou Skizas hit timely doubles that chased in a total of five runs as Seattle overcame a 4-3 San Diego lead in the eighth inning.

The Rainiers now have nine wins and eight losses for the regular season and share third place with Portland.

In other PCL action Sunday, Spokane held on to its league lead as it split a pair of games with Salt Lake City. The Bees won the first game, 10-8, but the Indians came back for a 4-1 win in the nightcap as 7,133 fans looked on in 40 degree weather.

Portland belted Tacoma, 5-0, in a rain-shortened seven inning game at Portland and Sacramento stayed on Spokane's first place heels with a 3-1, win over Vancouver in 12 innings.

Portland got two runs in the third inning when Jim Bricewicz chased in a tally with a long triple and then crossed the plate himself on a sacrifice fly. That would have been enough to win it but the Beavers added three runs before the rain hit. The second game was postponed.
