

# Horn Stars But Victory Goes to Cal

Berkeley, Calif. — Darrell Horn of Oregon State was the big star here Saturday although his Beaver track and field team fell before California 76 1/2-54 1/2.

Horn won the broad jump, his specialty, sent a new OSC low hurdle record to win that event in 23.7, was third in the 100-yard dash and also ran in the mile relay. His broad jump distance was 23 9/16.

Amos Marsh of Oregon State won the 220 yard dash in 21.5 over California's Willie White, who won the 100 in 9.5. Marsh also was timed in 9.5 in the 100.

Norm Hoffman of OSC won the mile in 4:16.5 and the Beavers' Gary Stenlund took the javelin with 230 3/4.

## Nieder Breaks Shot Put Record At Drake Relays

United Press International Des Moines — Bill Nieder, a former Kansas star now in the Army, broke the recognized world shot put record in the Drake relays Saturday with a throw of 63 feet, 11 1/2 inches.

The mark was posted as Nieder beat record-holder Parry O'Brien for only the third time in 19 years. Nieder, who earlier this year tossed the 16-pound ball 65 feet 7 inches in the Texas relays, hit over 63 feet three times in his four measured tosses. His other tries were 63-10, 63-8, and 62-8 1/2, and he got his best distance on his fifth try.

O'Brien, whose world record toss of 63 feet 4 inches was set last year, hit 63 feet 1 1/4 inches in his first throw yesterday in the feature event.

Louisville, Ky. — Derby Town divided into Tompion leaders and Bally Ache boosters as Kentucky Derby week dawned today with only Tuesday's Derby trial left to produce new challengers for Saturday's 86th annual Rose Run.

## Skaters Tie Marriage Knot In New York

New York — Blonde world skating queen Carol Heiss, 20-year-old daughter of a baker who put the finishing touches on the wedding cake himself, was married Saturday to Hayes Alan Jenkins, 27, Olympic champion figure skater of 1958.

The wedding in fashionable St. Thomas Episcopal church on Fifth avenue culminated a romance that began at an ice skating rink when Carol was a teenager and Jenkins was a student.

Carol won the Olympic gold medal at Squaw Valley, Calif., in February. In March, she won her fifth world figure skating title.

The third Olympic figure skating champion in the family could not attend the wedding. Jenkins' brother, David, who won the men's title at Squaw Valley this year could not serve as best man because he was taking final examinations at Western Reserve university's medical school in Cleveland.

This was the bride's first wedding. When her friends were married, she was always away skating in competition. She did not find out what happened at a wedding until she went to the rehearsal for her own Friday.

The couple received full celebrity treatment. At least 1,000 persons crowded both sides of Fifth avenue to get a glimpse of the skaters when they left the church. The ceremony began 15 minutes late, but Carol's father, Edward Heiss, said the delay was planned to give the 350 guests time to be seated.

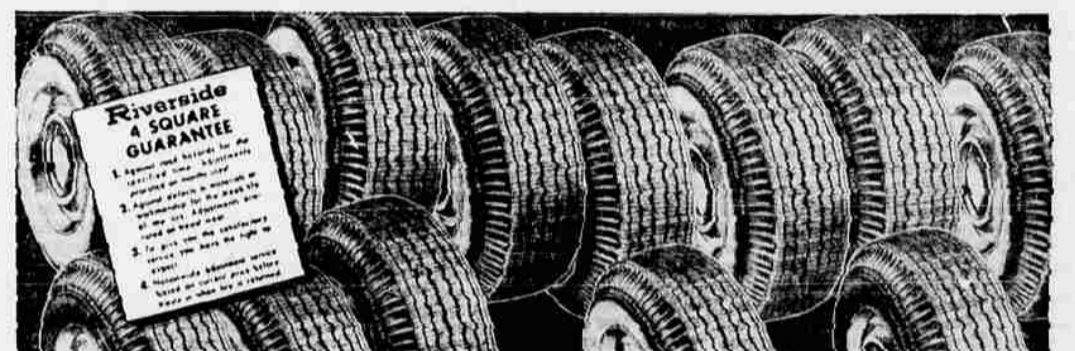
