# All London Bells to Ring for Margaret

By ROBERT MUSEL United Press International London—The bells of all London will ring out at 11 o'clock on the spring morning of May 6 when Princess Margaret rides to Westminster Abbey in her fairy tale glass coach to marry Antony Armstrong-Jones.

Two thousand guests will be packed into the 900-year old abbey, royal relations from many European countries, prime ministers of the Commonwealth, the great and the near-great in Britain and a sprinkling of the humbler friends of the young fair-haired bridegroom from his days as a photographer.

It will be Princess Margaret's day when she sets out from her Clarence House home which she shares with Queen Elizabeth, the queen mother. Beside her in the coach will be her brother-in-law Prince Philip, who will give her away.

Princess Margaret's wedding gown was designed by the court dressmaker, Norman Hartnell.

Hartnell also was designer of the frocks for the eight young bridesmaids who will follow the princess to the altar.

Chief bridesmaid naturally will be Princess Anne, the bride's niece, who will be 10 years old in August.

Another 6-year-old is Sarah Lowther, whose mother before her marriage was Jennifer Bevan and acted as lady-in-waiting to Princess Margaret.

The remaining bridesmaid is from the bridegroom's family. She is the Honorable Catherine Vesey, daughter of Tony's sister, Viscountess de Vesci who lives in Ireland.

The archbishop of Canterbury, Dr. Geoffrey Fisher, primate of the Church of England, will solemnize the marriage. The Church of England marriage service from the 1622 version of the Book of Common Prayer will be used.

He will be accompanied by his best man, Dr. Roger William Gilliatt, a consultant neurologist at the National Hospital for Nervous Disease, who has been his friend for the past six years.

The two men will wear the customary morning dress, just as Prince Philip will.

They will both stand at the foot of the chancel steps inside the abbey waiting for the bride.

Dr. Gilliatt's place in the ceremony will be to hold the ring until he hands it to the archbishop, who then hands it to the bridegroom to place on the bride's finger.

Already Princess Margaret and her fiancé have been to the abbey to discuss wedding arrangements with the clergy.

Hidden cameras and commentators will be placed inside the abbey but close-ups of most of the actual ceremony will not be permitted.

One thing certain is that Prince Charles, prince of Wales, will get a holiday from his school for the occasion.

Hundreds of wedding presents have already reached Clarence House from all parts of the world. Others are being sent to the groom who is staying at Buckingham Palace until the wedding.

The queen, the queen mother and other members of the immediate royal family circle will conform to custom by presenting Princess Margaret with jewels and gold and silverware to mark her wedding.

Some organizations and clubs will send Princess Margaret checks for her to pass on to her favorite charities.

The official presents will be on view to the general public at St. James' Palace sometime after the wedding.
