



DR. ESBY MCGILL
Named to Position

Business Educator Named Assistant To Dr. Stevenson

Ashland—The appointment of Dr. Esby C. McGill, outstanding business educator from the southwest, as assistant to the president at Southern Oregon college was confirmed at the April meeting of the state board of higher education, according to SOC president, Dr. Elmo N. Stevenson.

Dr. McGill will assume the position in September. Dr. Stevenson said, taking charge of academic instructional affairs, coordinating curriculum and research.

Listed in Who's Who in American Education since 1952, Dr. McGill graduated with distinction from Southwest Missouri State college. He attended graduate schools at Oklahoma A and M college, Texas A and M college, and Kansas State Teachers college.

He received his doctor of education degree from New York university in 1955, on the thesis subject "A Study of Business Skills and Knowledge Used by Business and Non-Business People." In 1956 he received the NYU founder's day award for his doctorate.

Dr. McGill is a coauthor of the complete course in briefhand, a widely used text in business and academic schools. He has written over 100 articles published in professional periodicals and yearbooks.

A former chairman of the division of business education at Kansas State Teachers college, Dr. McGill is presently a professor of business administration and secretarial science at Utah State university.

This summer Dr. McGill will instruct business education workshops at the University of Southern California in Los Angeles.

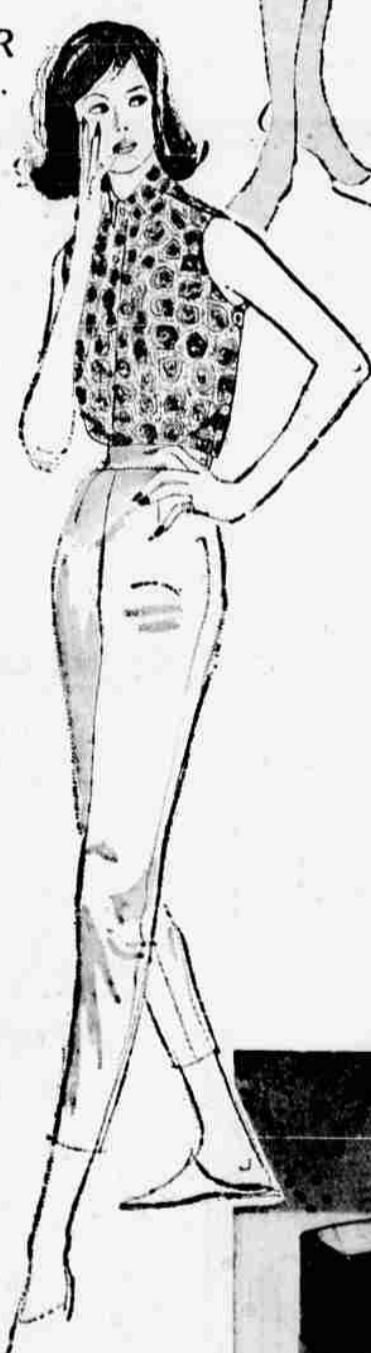
