Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a physician, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a woman's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and consumers.

Mrs. K. J. - She won't find anyone as good as Neal.

Carol J. - But I felt so much more for Bill.

Mrs. K. J. - I am terribly concerned about my daughter Carol, who is 24 and engaged to a very fine young man. Unfortunately she doesn't appreciate her good luck.

A couple of years ago Carol was desperately in love with another boy who kept her on the string and finally married one of her best friends. We feared she would have a breakdown, but fortunately Neal came along in the nick of time and saved the situation.

Now Carol has begun to find fault with Neal for trivial things. She feels very shaky about the marriage, but I am sure there is no real reason for this. Neal is good looking, dependable, makes a good living, comes of a fine family and is kind and thoughtful. Carol won't find anyone as good.

Carol J. - I realize that all my mother says of Neal is true. Everyone likes him and things I'm lucky to get him, and I guess I am. Yet I can't help comparing the feeling I have for him with the feeling I had for Bill and I know this doesn't measure up.

It's true that Bill was never as kind and considerate as Neal is and he isn't even as good looking or successful. Yet I know the feeling I experienced for him was so overwhelming and intense it can't be compared to anything I feel for Neal.

I know marriage with Neal couldn't be bad. It would probably be as happy as most, but I'm afraid I'll still think about Bill and that would be bad for both of us.

The Council, although Neal is so desirable a young man, the engagement is unfortunate since it was contracted on the rebound and it now being held together by pressure from without.

Marriage requires a deep commitment of mind and feelings. Satisfactory marriages cannot be made when they must be bolstered from the outside.

Mrs. K. J. isn't being really helpful to her daughter when she overpressures her. She is right to speak up in favor of a desirable marriage, but she should make it clear that her responsibility must end there. Carol must consult her own mind and her feelings before making the final decision and she can't do this when the outside clamor is too great.

Carol shows herself as a rather undeveloped emotionally. Her description of her feelings for Bill reveals only an infatuation. Most human beings go through at least one such experience in a lifetime, but if they develop further emotionally they look back upon it with a rather skeptical eye - recognizing that they could hardly endure day-to-day existence with the object of the infatuation. When such a "love" stands between a young man and woman and all future relationships, it is simply being used as a device to avoid mature love.

Carol needs more time for growing up. Her engagement is premature as long as she has these many doubts about the marriage.

**United States Agrees To Send Grain To India**  
Washington - (AP) - The United States has signed an agreement to furnish India 17 million tons of grain to help the populous Asian nation build up a food reserve against future famine.

President Eisenhower, in signing the four-year agreement, called it by far the biggest surplus food deal ever made by the United States.

**One Load a Day**  
An average of one shipload of wheat a day for the next four years will leave from the United States for India to deliver the 357 million bushels of wheat and 22 million bags of rice sold under the agreement. The first shipment will leave in July.

Agriculture Secretary Ezra T. Benson said at the White House signing ceremony the wheat involved is "nearly equal to half an average U.S. wheat crop and is more wheat than we consume in the United States as food in an entire year. The volume of rice is substantially more than half an average U.S. rice crop and is substantially more rice than we consume as food in any one year."

**Pay Mostly in Rupees**  
India will pay \$1,300,000,000 for it over a longer period. Some of the payment will be in American dollars, but most will be in Indian rupees.

Part of the money will be loaned back to India for development and other projects, under the provisions of Public Law 480. Most of the rest of the payment will be used by the U.S. Embassy in New Delhi.

**Hotel in Taipei Oasis of Plush Amidst Austerity**  
Taipei, Formosa - (AP) - The Grand hotel, stopping place for presidents and kings, is an oasis of plush in a city of austerity.

Built on the site of a Japanese shinto shrine, Taipei's Grand hotel is Nationalist China's showpiece resort for tourists with big names or fat wallets.

The Shah of Iran slept there as did King Hussein of Jordan and President Ngo Dinh Diem of South Vietnam.

President Carlos P. Garcia of the Philippines was the Grand's most recent distinguished visitor, stopping for five days with President Chiang Kai-Shek.

The hotel's entire Golden Dragon pavilion of 36 rooms, four suites, two dining rooms and a staircase cocktail lounge was reserved for President and Mrs. Garcia and their party.

The cost was \$488 per day, or \$2,440 for their five-day stay.

Built on a hill where Japanese once worshipped their sun goddess, the Grand hotel commands a sweeping view of Taipei's ramshackle, grimy, soot-stained houses and buildings.

The front section was constructed in 1952. Two other sections - the Golden Dragon pavilion and the Jade Phoenix wing - were added later.

A huge torii arch, final reminder that the hotel sprung from holy Japanese soil, was torn down last year and replaced with a Chinese gateway.

**Western Style**  
The Grand, air-conditioned and western style throughout, is decorated in rich Chinese reds and blacks.

The ceilings are painted in elaborate mosaic patterns inspired by the ancient palace of Peking.

Chinese scrolls, misty scenes from the homeland the Nationalists lost, hang from the walls.

A Chinese architect designed the hotel, but the interior decoration was suggested by two women - China's famed Madame Chiang Kai-Shek and a little-known American here of the cold war, Sue Buol.

Mrs. Buol spent years in Taipei, busy with scores of civic projects waiting for the Chinese Communists to release her airline pilot husband from prison.
