West Berliners Still Proving Ability To Accept Anything

Berlin — When 142 million pounds of bombs fell on the city in 1945 major Anglo-American air raids in World War II, Berliners lived by the motto "Enjoy the war, the peace will be worse."

Today, as in World War II, they are trying to enjoy themselves while they fear the worst.

Therefore 2,200,000 West Berliners look ahead with their fingers crossed to May 18 when President Eisenhower, Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev, French President Charles de Gaulle and British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan sit down in Paris at a meeting that might decide their future.

"Fear Red Take-Over"
Their fear is that in one way or another the Soviets will push through their plan to make West Berlin a so-called free, demilitarized city and the Communists will take over.

Or that if the Western Allies continue to veto the Soviet plan, the Communists will interfere with traffic to the city isolated 110 miles deep in East German territory.

Normal Days Lacking
"Fear" perhaps is too strong a word for Berlin's feeling. The average Berliner hasn't had many normal days since the outbreak of World War I in 1914. He's lived through war and defeat, inflation, Nazi-Communist riots, Hitler,

air raids, Russian conquest, occupation and blockade. One such experience would do most people for a lifetime.

If he seems courageous now and a bit nonchalant in the face of the Soviet threat it might be because it's not possible to be afraid forever.
