Lost Boat Found; Two Men Dead

Coos Bay - (AP) - A 32-foot boat missing since last Sunday on a 20-mile trip from here to Winchester Bay was found Friday with both men aboard dead.

The Coast Guard said the victims were Donald C. McCulloch and Robert D. Nelson, both of North Bend. They may have died of asphyxiation.

The craft, "G and G," was located by the Navy tug Calca about 16 miles northwest of the Umpqua river.

The tug reported the craft was half submerged. The Coast Guard said the boat was reported to have had a leaky exhaust and that there were no other outward signs of death.

A search had been conducted unsuccessfully all week. The boat was taken to Winchester Bay and the bodies were returned here on a Coast Guard patrol vessel.

Portland - (AP) - Former Oregon Gov. Elmo Smith said here Friday night that the state's young Republicans should give special attention to education, senior citizens and the challenge of automation.

Smith, who is seeking Republican nomination for the United States senate, spoke to about 100 delegates of the Young Republican Federation of Oregon.

Sewer Assessment On Springbrook Is Deferred by Council

The Medford city council Thursday night agreed to defer until the next meeting a proposed assessment for a sanitary sewer on Springbrook rd. to give property owners a chance to be heard.

The assessment concerns the property on Springbrook rd. from a point approximately 600 feet south of West Roberts rd., to 800 feet north of Buckshot Hill rd.

The sanitary sewer is completed, but the assessed cost would run considerably over the original estimate due to a large amount of rock encountered during installation.

The lateral front foot assessment on the project is \$4.36. The cost per connection is \$85. The original estimate was \$3 and \$40, respectively.

Salem Population Nears 49,000 Mark

Salem - (AP) - Preliminary federal census figures released here put Salem's total population at 48,799 - up 5,659 from 1950.

City officials had predicted that the capital's new count would run as high as 52,000.

Ronald Blundell, district census supervisor, emphasized that the figures were preliminary and that the final official total should run slightly higher.

Preliminary 1960 population figures for Marion county are 120,136, up 18,735 from 1950.
