

Former Panama President Leading

Panama City — (UPI)—Former President Ricardo M. Arias lengthened his lead on two rivals today in general elections for a successor to Panamanian President Ernesto de la Guardia Jr.

With 78 of 930 polling places recorded, Arias had 4,481 votes. Robert Francisco Chirri, a rancher, 7,972 votes, and Victor Florencio Goytia, an attorney, 4,815 votes.

Chairman Isais Pinilla said a winner would not be known, even unofficially, until this evening.
