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The Medical Roundup

Some of the most grateful letters I get each week come from fine wives who tell me that when suddenly their husbands became strange, irascible, irascible, unreasonable, not at all their old selves, and perhaps unable to work, and when for months no one seemed to be able to guess what had gone wrong, it was such a comfort to run onto one of my articles on the usual symptoms produced by the very common little strokes.

Scientists Seek To Tab TB Germs

Washington (Science Service) — By analyzing the inherent chemistry of tuberculosis germs using modern laboratory methods, it may be possible soon to identify all strains of the bacilli quickly and easily.

Dr. H. M. Randall said here at the American Physical Society that some chemical compounds have been identified in laboratory experiments using chromatography and infrared spectroscopy. The trick now becomes that of finding chemical compounds that always show up in specific strains of the germs.

The University of Michigan physicist said it may even be possible to find in each strain a single chemical compound not found in other strains. Some strains at present lack properties that positively identify them. Discovery of specific compounds for these strains "would not simply add another method of identification but would be the one method," he said.
