

Crescent City Sets Celebration On May 28 and 29

Crescent City, Calif. — Crescent City is doling up and faking on a festive air this week in anticipation of the 10th anniversary celebration of her famed Citizen's Dock, which has been set for May 28 and 29.

Ten years ago the citizens of Crescent City, without governmental or outside help, banded together and built their own dock entirely with material, labor and money donated by the people.

From a small harbor 10 years ago, Crescent City has grown to be the largest port in California north of the Golden Gate.

Harbor business has increased from a tonnage of 2,061 in 1950 to a tonnage of 662,572 in 1959. The value of the tonnage in 1950 was \$133,215. In 1959 it was \$60,537,850.

Parade Scheduled

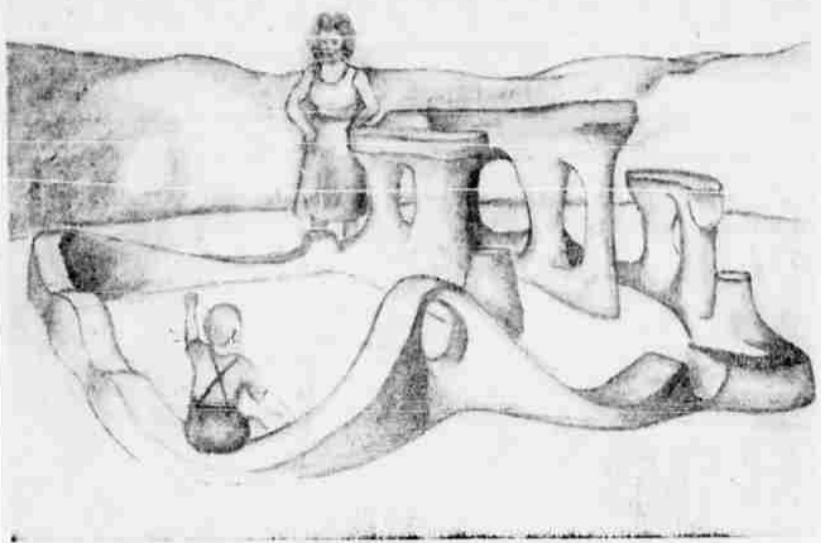
A variety of festivities has been planned for the three day celebration. Getting the long week end pageantry underway will be a parade, which has been slated for 1 p.m. Saturday, May 28. Bands and local drill teams, plus marching groups from the Navy and Air Force are just a few of the units expected to participate.

Following the parade, state, county and city officials will join the citizens of Del Norte on the wharf for ceremonies rededicating Citizen's Dock.

An anniversary ball has been planned for Saturday night and will be held at the pavilion at the Del Norte County Fairgrounds.

One of the highlights Sunday will be the arrival of the Navy Minesweeper, USS Thrasher. Visitors will have the opportunity of boarding the 144 foot long Navy ship.

Josephine County School District May Set Election

Grants Pass — The Josephine county unit school district board this week decided, with conditions, to resubmit a budget to district voters. The first budget was defeated May 2.

The board ruled that petitions asking that a budget be resubmitted must be filed before 5 p.m., Wednesday, May 18. This applies to petitions for the same budget as was first submitted as well as those desiring a revised and reduced budget.

Each petition must contain at least 1,000 signatures of registered voters living within the district. A new election technically is still only "possible" since petitions must be filed before the board will order another vote.

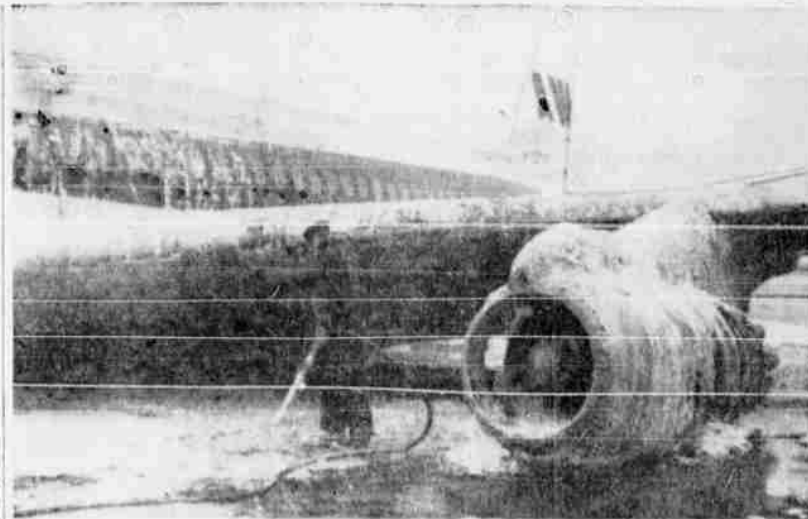
Adopt Austerity Plan

On May 3, the day following the election, the board adopted an austerity plan which called for a lower operating budget. The plan would eliminate \$668,320 from the defeated budget of \$1,626,035 which would have increased the 6 per cent limitation by \$750,865.

Under the plan, tuition and transportation costs for the several hundred students living outside the city limits who attend schools in Grants Pass would be the responsibilities of the parents.

The plan would cut \$121,660 in transportation costs for the county unit; \$40,000 in similar costs for students attending city schools; \$333,500 in tuition fees to Grants Pass city schools; \$61,185 in proposed capital outlay and \$35,100 in previously approved salary increases.

The board operates 14 elementary schools as well as Cave Junction and Illinois Valley High schools.

Portland May Not Hit 400,000 Mark

Portland—Portland may not reach the 400,000 mark in population as expected, according to census takers.

Mrs. Jean K. Young, director of the local census office, said on the basis of current reports population estimates in the city seem too high and estimates in suburban areas too low. She said the Portland census was running about two weeks behind schedule.

Early estimates had figured the city's population might reach 405,000 to 407,000.
