

**JET SETS RECORD**

Atlanta - (UPI) - A Delta Airlines Convair 440, the nation's newest and fastest commercial jet airliner, Wednesday set a new transcontinental speed record between San Diego, Calif., and Atlanta. The jet flew 1,935 miles in three hours, 23 minutes and 49 seconds and at an average ground speed of 580 miles an hour.

**Ship Dispute at Portland Settled**

San Francisco - (UPI) - The controversy over the size of the crew of the Portland-docked Matson Line freighter the "Hawaiian Citizen" is over.

The dispute was settled here Wednesday by a Federal Conciliation Service-appointed arbitrator, Sam Kagel.

Kagel ruled that the "Hawaiian Citizen" will make sail with a crew of 48 men as contended by the Pacific Maritime Association and not the 51 as contended by the Seaman's union.

The vessel will sail from Portland to San Francisco on Friday where it will take on cargo for Hawaii in the container yards. It has been tied up as the result of the labor dispute since April 26.

**Ex-Polish Skipper Seeks Citizenship**

New York - (UPI) - The captain of the Polish liner Batory which carried stowaway Communist leader Gerhardt Eisler out of this country has taken his first step toward becoming an American citizen.

Jan Cwiklinski, 59, the former skipper, now operates an ice cream business in Clifton, N.J.

Cwiklinski, who commanded the Batory for seven and a half years jumped ship in England shortly after the bail-jumping Eisler stowed away aboard his vessel to flee the United States.

The captain came to this country in 1954 and was granted a permanent residence visa in 1955. Since then he has lived alone in a Manhattan apartment.

He wants next to bring his wife and two children from Communist Poland.

**Pensioners Found Slain at Tacoma**

Tacoma - (UPI) - Two elderly men, both pensioners and neighbors, were shot to death here Wednesday night.

The victims were Ralph R. Loveland, 76, and Joseph James Taylor, 71. Each had been shot in the head.

Loveland was found in a chair in the living room and Taylor was found dead in bed. Samuel Green discovered the bodies about 4 p.m. Persons in the neighborhood said they saw the two men as late as 2 p.m.

A .32 caliber Colt automatic pistol, believed to be the death weapon, was found in the house. Robbery was believed to be the motive behind the double slaying as one man's wallet was found empty and the other's was missing.

**LACKS CONFIDENCE**  
Knoxville, Tenn. - (UPI) - The Democratic party "lacks confidence" in Southerners and hence will not nominate Senate Leader Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas as its presidential candidate, Interior Secretary Fred Seaton said Tuesday night.

**Eagle Point Man Honored at Dinner**

Orville Henderson, Eagle Point, was honored on his retirement from the Oregon state highway department at a potluck dinner and meeting of Crater Lake chapter No. 16 of the Oregon State Employees association Tuesday night.

Allen Byrd, Lincoln, was elected president of the chapter.

Henderson has had 25 years service with the highway department, all at Eagle Point. At the time of retirement, he was a foreman's helper. He plans a trip to Los Angeles to visit relatives then will return to his Eagle Point home. Fellow workers and OSEA members presented Henderson an electric drill for his workshop.

Other officers named were Ray D. Gillespie, Prospect, vice president, and William Don Stanley, Medford, secretary.

**Peiping Warns on U.S. Air Missions**

Tokyo - (UPI) - Peiping Radio said today Japan will have to take the consequences if U.S. planes based in this country fly intelligence missions over Red China.

"We issue a warning to the Premier Nobusuke (Kishi government)..." said a Peiping broadcast, quoting what it said was an editorial in the Communist Chinese "People's Daily."

"It must bear full responsibility for whatever consequences follow if it continues to permit U.S. planes based in Japan to conduct spy activities against Red China."

The U.S. government already had assured Japan the three U-2 jets stationed in Japan - models comparable to the plane shot down over Russia on May Day - have not been and will not be used for intelligence flights.

**County School Heads Set Meeting**

Salem - (UPI) - The 1960 conference of Oregon county school superintendents ended here Wednesday afternoon. About 100 persons attended the meeting.

One of the last orders of business was discussion of a suggestion by Clackamas county school superintendent Les Rood of the possibility of extending jurisdiction of community college districts to take in 11th and 12th grade high school students for vocational training, if high schools determine certain students would benefit from such a program.

A law was passed by the 1959 Legislature providing for establishment of the community college districts.

No action was taken on Rood's suggestion.
