Some Features of Epilepsy
 An intelligent young woman writes to say that, early in life, she suffered as so many epileptics do, with petit mal, one of the two main forms of epilepsy. In her spells she would just remain silent for some seconds. Her eyes would turn up, and she would not answer her mother's anxious questions. At the age of 13, my correspondent began to have grand mal, or falling spells. Now she objects to my statement that many epileptics have a violent temper. Of course, they all don't. I did not say that, but most that I see do. A hundred times I have gotten my hunch that the nervous patient sitting before me was epileptic the minute I saw how irritable he was with his wife. Then I got him to confess that some of his forebears were violent men with a terrible temper. Many an epileptic—even without fits—has told me that he had such a temper that he never dared argue with anyone, as in a bar, for fear he would get so angry that he would attack the man and try to kill him. Nearly all epileptic fathers of children tell me that they never have dared to spank a child for fear of being unable to quit. The wife will say of such a man, "When he is himself he is a dear, but every so often, when he gets very irritable, or has a terrible headache, or gets into one of his woody spells, he is another person whom I don't know, and am much afraid of. He may then say terrible things to me that later he has no memory of."

My correspondent tells me that her physicians have told her that her disease is not hereditary, so she can go ahead and have all the children she wants. But as she says, even as a lay woman, she knows better than that. She knows that the doctors were trying to be kind, but she doubts if lying to people is a kindness.
