

### Vigilance Needed To Help Solve Poison Problem

Accidental poisoning of children is a problem which can be solved only through continuous parental vigilance and supervision, Medford Chamber of Commerce Manager Don McNeil warned this week.

Inquisitive toddlers, McNeil said, continue to swallow a wide variety of toxic substances common to many households despite repeated medical warnings.

McNeil cited a chart recently issued by the American Medical Association's committee on toxicology which lists these eight rules to prevent poisoning:

Keep all drugs, poisonous substances and household chemicals out of reach of children.

Nonedible Products Do not store nonedible products on shelves used for storing food.

Do not transfer poisonous substances to unlabeled containers.

Never reuse containers of chemical substances.

Do not leave discarded medicines where children or pets might get at them.

Never tell children you are giving them candy when you are actually giving them medicine.

Read labels before using chemical products.

Never give or take medicines in the dark.

To treat poisoning, the chart lists these instructions:

**Stop Absorption**

"Stop absorption of the poison. Speed is essential. If possible, one person should begin treatment while another calls a physician. If not, the nature of the poison will determine whether to call a physician or begin first aid measures first. Save the poison container and material itself if any remains. If the poison is not known, save a sample of the vomitus."

The chart also lists first aid measures covering recommended treatment for poisons which enter the body through various methods.
