Ike Not Acting Like Lame Duc On Eve of Summit Conference

President Eisenhower approaches the Paris summit meeting in a manner most unlike a Lame Duck presi-

dent who'll be out of office in a few months. Instead of sitting out the remainder of his term in the solitude and comfort of the White House, Eisenhower is working on foreign policy like a man just beginning his White House career. After the summit, there'll be Russia, Japan and possibly some other foreign visits before he leaves office.

He has changed greatly since taking office. His military command concept of running the White House has

undergone extensive alteration. He once thought he could save himself for only the most major decisions; now he finds himself getting into many relatively minor matters and he seems to enjoy the presidency more than he did when Sherman Adams as chief foreman of the place kept many troublesome matters away from his boss.

After his first summit conference at Geneva in 1955, Eisenhower has quite disappointed at the inability of the foreign ministers to put the so-called "Spirit of Gen-

eva" into operation. The President in this period of disappointment started to wonder whether he had been doing as much as he could for world peace.

Might Improve Climate
He began to explore his ideas with the late Secretary of State John Foster Dulles. Eisenhower was quite dispirited from country to country, and by exchanging visits with other state heads, he might produce an improved climate of international relations. Dulles was opposed to the

idea at first, but eventually he came around to the belief that Eisenhower's World War II record and his far-reaching popularity might well be used to promote better friendship for the United States at a time when the image of America was becoming ugly in some important world areas.

Three Major Tours
Eisenhower has made three major foreign tours since the late summer of 1959. For a man 69 years old, he should be thoroughly exhausted. But to the amazement of many of those close to him, he seems

in better health than he's enjoyed in years. He is fascinated by his recent travels and delights in describing for friends with great verve and gusto what he saw and what he heard.

Federal Poultry Inspection Funds May Be Restored

Washington—UPI—The Senate was expected to restore the House-killed funds for federal inspection to insure wholesome poultry for consumers.

The House approved by voice vote Wednesday a \$3,937,943,500 Agriculture Department money bill after its floor managers knocked out the inspection funds.

But the Senate was certain to restore most if not all the \$26,838,000 for poultry checking and other marketing services.

Reps. Jaime L. Whitten (D-Miss.) and Fred Marshall (D-Minn.), who helped draft the money bill, resorted to a parliamentary maneuver to knock out the inspection funds.

Viewed as Maneuver
Their surprise action was viewed as a maneuver designed to win ultimate congressional approval of a relaxation in requirements for government inspection labels on cooked poultry products. These include canned chicken and soups and frozen poultry TV dinners.

As passed, the bill called for more subsidies to farmers for conservation practices and more lending for rural electrification and other programs than the administration recommended.

The direct cash appropriations fell \$197,319,690 short of the funds requested by the President. Most of the reduction, however, was in surplus price support funds which weren't earmarked for spending in the next fiscal year starting July 1.

OLCC Tightens Up Food Regulations

Portland—UPI—The Oregon Liquor Control Commission has adopted tougher regulations regarding sale of food in commercial establishments licensed to sell liquor.

Private clubs are not affected.

A new rule effective July 1 requires that gross receipts from sale of food during every 60-day period shall amount to not less than one-fourth of the gross receipts from the sale of both food and alcoholic liquor during the same period.

Another rule requires that commercial establishments while open for business must provide regular meals during the usual hours when such meals are regularly served. They also must provide short orders or other such foods at
