Bill Would Deny Wage Authority

Washington—(AP)—The House Agriculture Committee has approved a bill that would deny Labor Secretary James P. Mitchell any authority over wages of domestic farm workers.

It also would extend for two years the law under which Mexican farmhands are imported for work on U.S. farms.

The bill, approved Thursday, was certain to draw administration opposition.

Under present law the Mexican labor import program will expire in June, 1961.

Educational TV Grants Defeated

Washington—(AP)—The House rules committee has shelved a proposal to authorize \$39 million in federal grants for the construction of educational television stations.

By a 5-5 tie vote, the committee refused to clear the controversial bill for action on the House floor. Five Democrats voted to give the measure a go-ahead. Four Republicans and one Democrat opposed it.

Members said the vote killed the bill for this session of Congress.

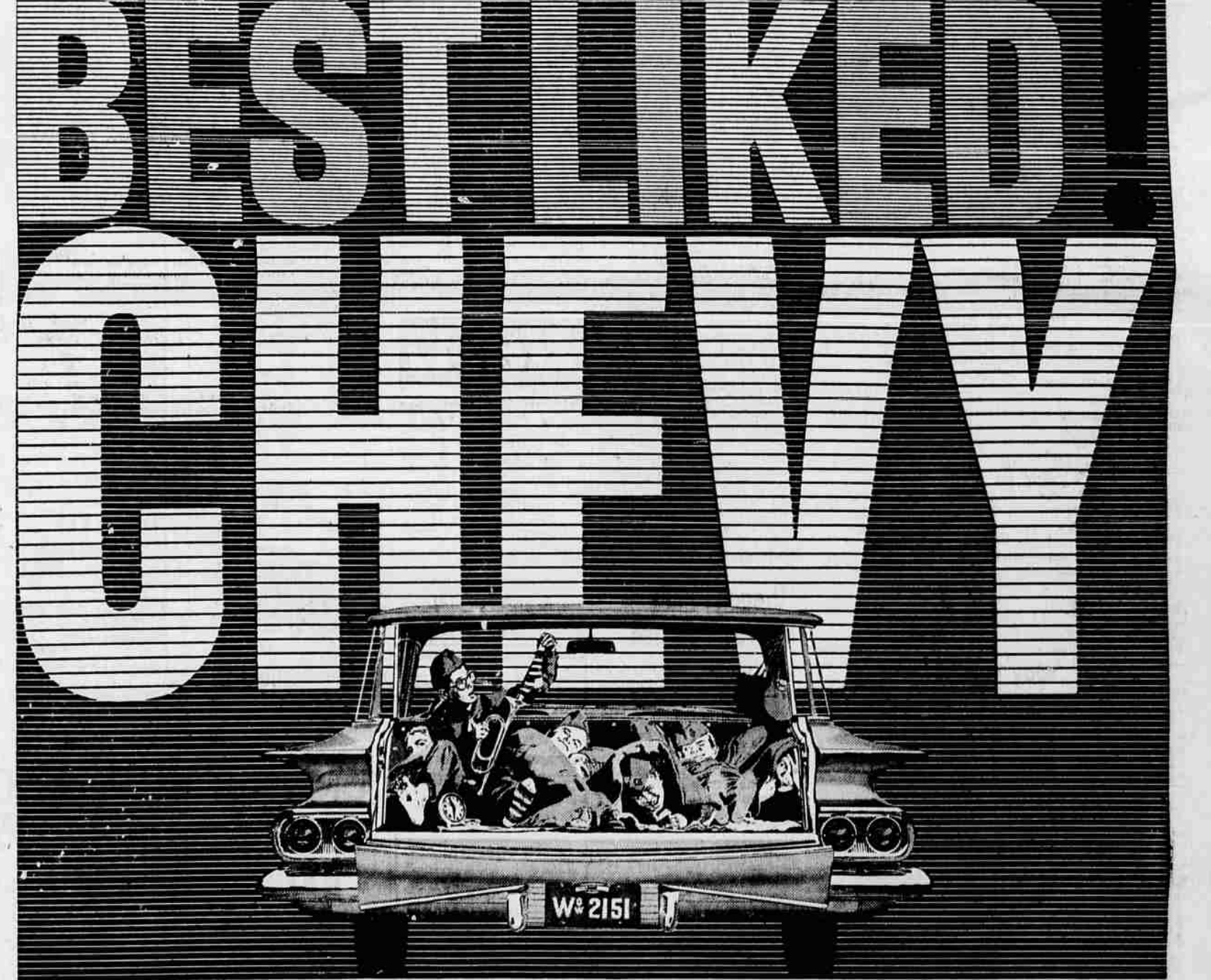
WOMAN LAWYER DIES
