

Maids Oppose Salem Saturday

White City - Diamond season at the Veterans Administration Domiciliary's Memorial stadium will open here Saturday night.

The occasion will be a 1960 inaugural in the Northwest Women's Major Softball league matching the Rogue Valley Dairy Maids and the Salem Shamrocks. Play ball time is 8 p.m. The teams vie again at 1:30 p.m. Sunday.

The Shamrocks are the defending women's champions of the Oregon State Softball association. They won the crown here last August, taking five straight victories after losing their opening tournament game. Rogue Valley was state champ in 1958.

Each of the clubs is expected to have about the same personnel as in 1959 when Salem won three out of five games in the Maids. The clubs split regular season play and the Shamrocks won a state meet game from Rogue Valley.

Pat Barron is expected to pitch for the Dairy Maids with Jean Main handling the catching assignment. Doris Hickson is a likely starter at first base with Janet Pfaff at second, Shirley Hanson at third and Helen Wolgamott at shortstop.

Jan Bateman and Ellen Callaghan are probable outfielders and for the other field spot choice is among Tony Owens, Betty Ann Higday and Phyllis Perry. Miss Perry is competing in the state tennis tourney, which is today and tomorrow at Corvallis.

Marge Hurley, who manages Salem, was named outstanding pitcher of the state tourney last year, and Deloris Hanson, shortstop, was designated outstanding player other than pitcher. Others on the state title crew included Maurine Schollian, Jane Lowell, Sherry Larson, Sue Hendrick, Betty Mantyla, Charlotte Kenagy and Vivian Reaves.

Kermit McLemore Paces Red Raiders in Batting

Ashland - Kermit McLemore capped the 1960 baseball campaign with a terrific 511 average to lead the Southern Oregon College batting statistics for the regular season.

McLemore had 24 base hits in 47 trips to the plate but he was not just an offensive ball player. The Red Raider third sacker did not commit an error in any of the 15 games he played in for a perfect 1,000 fielding mark.

Phil Sword, with a bulging .353 average, was the leading run producer with 15 runs batted in. He was also second in runs scored with 15.

Eldon Francis led in runs scored with 16 and Bob Jones was the top base stealer with seven. Francis also had the most extra base blows with seven on five doubles and two triples.

Lefty John Younger topped the pitching with a 5-1 season and a respectable 2.10 earned run mark. Younger also set a new Oregon record with 21 strikeouts in a nine inning game.

Younger was tops in innings pitched with 47 and in strikeouts at 50 while Alan McKinnis had the top earned run average for pitchers who were credited with wins or losses as he posted a 1.13 mark.

As a team the Raiders batted .324, a mark that will put them near the top in national standings. The Raiders averaged 6.9 runs per game and 10.1 hits.

The season is not quite over, with the District 2 NAIA tournament to be played in Portland, May 20 and 21. For the Raiders the regular season saw a 12-5 record. The Raiders gained their "winning" season with a nine-game triumph streak.

Competitive Swim Activities To Be Organized at Park Pool

An organizational meeting for a competitive swimming program to be sponsored by Medford's parks and recreation department will be held Monday at 7:30 p.m. at the Hawthorne park swimming pool.

Swimming instruction and team workouts will begin in the evenings from 7:30 p.m. following Monday's organizational meeting. All interested youths, boys and girls alike, should attend this meeting, Haworth noted.

Emphasis of the program Haworth said, will be on coaching, and developing skills and training habits for those who are interested in competitive swimming.
