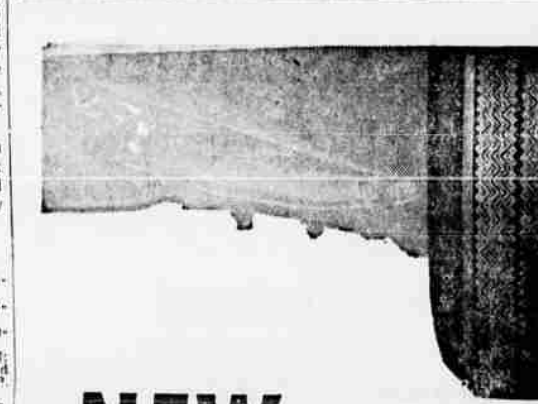
Class B and A-2 high school track and field men of this area will have their sights on state meet berths Saturday when they contend at the Southern Oregon college field at Ashland.
