The annual all chapter swimming party is planned for the week of July 11, the date to be announced later.



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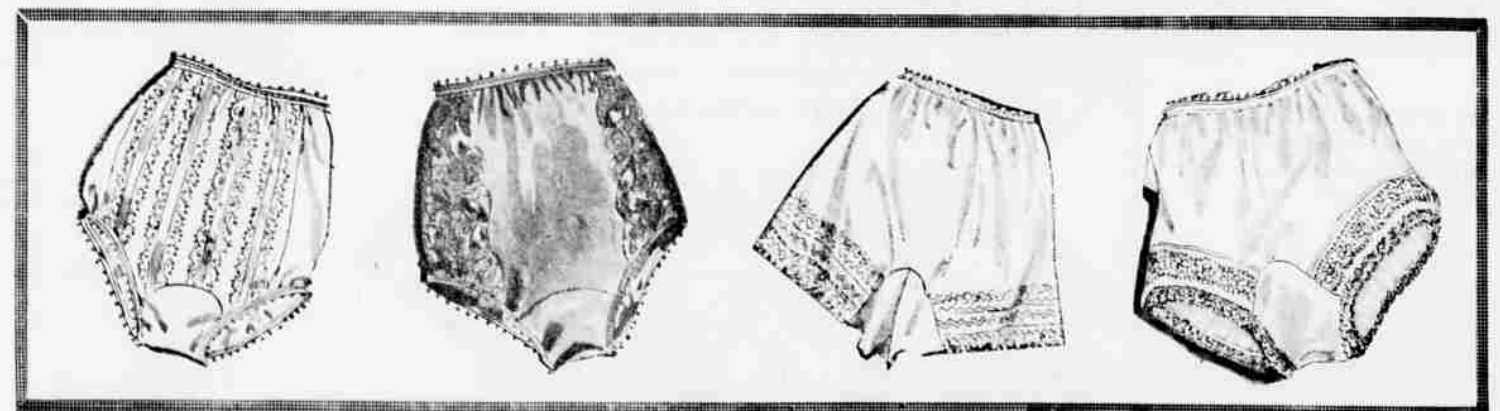
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
