## Morse, Kennedy Return To Oregon For Final Drives

Salem — (UPI) — Sens. Wayne Morse of Oregon and John Kennedy of Massachusetts, butting heads in the May 20 Oregon primary, return to the state in the next few days to begin a furious final week of campaigning.

At stake are 17 delegate votes — bound to the winner until one of four things happen at the convention: The Oregon candidate is nominated, he receives less than 35 per cent of the vote, he releases the delegates or until two convention ballots have been taken.

Morse had come out as a favorite son last summer, the party would "no doubt have supported him. He waited too long." They aren't officially supporting anyone else either.

At 8 p.m. Monday the two will make speeches only a few miles apart — Kennedy at the University of Portland and Morse in suburban Beaverton.

Wednesday evening they will appear at rallies in Portland. Their schedules do not call for them to cross each other's path.

Sen. Hubert Humphrey (D-Minn.) made it a Kennedy-Morse showdown by dropping out of the Democratic presidential sweepstakes after his poor showing in West Virginia.

Humphrey's name remains on the Oregon ballot though, along with those of Sens. Lyndon Johnson (D-Texas) and Stuart Symington (D-Mo.).

**Morse Due Monday**

This will be the only primary in which Kennedy is pitted against all these Democratic hopefuls.

During the week Morse will also hit Eugene, Newport and Oregon City and will wind up in Eugene Friday where he flies back to Washington, D.C. Saturday evening.

Kennedy has appearances in The Dalles, Tillamook, Eugene, Springfield, Salem, St. Helens and Oregon City with a quickie trip to Idaho on Friday, returning to Portland that night.

**Son Wanted at Side of Dying Father**

Pasadena, Tex. — (UPI) — Authorities here issued a plea Friday for the son of a dying man to come to his father's bedside.

The son, Jess J. Milburn, is believed to be living in Portland, Ore., Seattle or Tacoma, Wash.

Doctors at the Pasadena hospital said he should contact either the hospital or a brother, Jim Milburn, who lives in Bartlesville, Okla.

Morse, who has spent much of his campaign reiterating that he is seriously after the nomination, arrives in Portland at 4:38 p.m. Monday. Kennedy starts his appearances a day sooner.

The Morse forces still reject any idea that Kennedy has "narrowed the gap" in Oregon.

Morse got into the race when a petition was filed under Oregon's unique primary law making him a candidate whether he liked it or not.

He expected to win the District of Columbia primary, and lost, expects to lose in Maryland next Tuesday and figures he will win in Oregon despite the fact that no one has stopped Kennedy yet.

Morse goes into the election with the endorsement of eight Democratic county central committees but without the endorsement of the state party organization. Morse supporters immediately sought endorsement for him when he announced his candidacy last January but Oregon party brass decided that it was too late. Various Democratic factions had already lined up for already-announced candidates.

**Waited 'Too Long'**

## Proposed Annexation of Area West of City is Recommended

Medford's city planning commission Thursday recommended against a requested change of zone on Eighth st. between 13th and Holly sts. and recommended a proposed annexation to the city.

The area requesting to be annexed includes 3.3 acres of land between Alberts st. on the west, the existing city limits on the east, Prune st. on the north, and an extension of Dakota st. on the south.

City Manager Robert A. Duff said the petition apparently has been signed by 100 per cent of the property owners. One of the reasons they are requesting to be annexed is because of a sanitary problem, he noted.

The recommendation will now go to the city council for its consideration.

**Request Change**

Medford Attorney Robert A. Boyer had requested the zone change on Eighth st. from Class II, multiple family, to Class III, commercial, so that a service station could be erected on the site.

Boyer was representing himself and a number of other persons who have an interest in the property. Several persons, including representatives from the First Presbyterian church, appeared in opposition to the request.

In recommending to the city council that the request be denied, the commission noted that a service station would generate congesting traffic on Eighth st. which is a one-way arterial.

The commission also noted that there are no other commercial developments in this immediate area and to allow one to enter might be setting a bad precedent which could result in harmful "strip development."

The commission gave its favorable recommendation to a request that an undeveloped alley between Hawthorne and Genesee sts., north of East Main st., be vacated. Duff

noted the city has no utilities or easements in the alley and no contemplated use for it.

Requests from two different people that they be allowed to operate beauty shops at 880 Stewart ave. and 1015 Winchester st., as home occupations, were approved by the commission.

## Porter Urges OK Of Red China Offer

Washington — (UPI) — Rep. Charles O. Porter (D-Ore.) said in a letter Friday the State Department should take up Red China's offer for a mutual exchange of newsmen.

Porter referred to a news report that Premier Chou En-Lai had offered to sign an agreement with the United States on mutual exchange of correspondents.

The State Department has refused to grant Porter permission to visit Red China.

In a letter to Secretary of State Christian A. Herter, Porter said "if the Chinese should refuse to make such an agreement, the proof of their unwillingness could be communicated tellingly to all the world."

## Sentence Imposition Suspended in Court

Mrs. Ruby Ann Carlisle, 22, of 814 West Eighth st., Medford, had the imposition of sentence suspended for three years in circuit court Wednesday. She was charged with uttering and publishing a false check.

Mrs. Carlisle was ordered to refrain from using alcoholic beverages and places selling the same.

hearing on the proposal. The commission also called a public hearing for the next meeting on a request for change of zone from class IB, single and two family, to class II, multiple family, for property east of Bear Creek and south of the proposed 10th st. extension.

The homes are located in class IB single and two family zones. Under the zoning regulations, some home occupations are permitted, and the commission felt that beauty shops came under the definition of home occupations in these cases.

Under the zoning laws, the operator of a home occupation must reside in the home, must not display, have or sell goods on the premises, must be the sole employee and must not use more than 25 per cent of the floor space of any one floor for the occupation.

Both operators have assured the commission that their occupations will not create a traffic problem.

**Considered Individually**

Commissioner Jack Edson noted that such requests as these must be considered individually and each be judged on its own merits.

The commission recommended to the city council that a dedicated street leading to Sacred Heart hospital in the Medford Heights addition be named "Medford Heights Lane," as requested by property owners in this area. The city council will call a public
